## 2016 MINUTES FRIDAY MORNING

The one hundred and forty seventh annual session of the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist in Christ, Inc. convened at the Midway Campground on Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 10:00 AM Eastern Daylight Savings Time. The moderator, Rev. Donald K. (Donnie) Wiggington invited everyone to be part of these worship services. The moderator asked Bro. Benny Walden to lead the body in prayer. Bro. Donnie welcomed all to this setting of the association. He then asked Rev. Josh Polston of the South Kentucky Association to lead the congregation in singing. He led *"He Lives" & "I'll Live in Glory"* while Sis. Mary Ann Sink played the piano. Bro. Nick Popplewell ran the sound system.

The moderator asked Bro. Allen Wiggington to come forward to lead the devotional service. Bro. Al read Luke 19:37-40. Bro. Al sang "Praise the Lord" and encouraged us to give the Lord his due praise. Prayer requests were made by the congregation and Rev. Terry Thrasher led in an altar of prayer.

The moderator led the congregation in the pledges to the American and Christian Flags, and the Holy Bible. The moderator asked that all standing delegates from the Central Indiana Association, which include all Ministers, Deacons, and Sunday School Superintendents, to stand in order to constitute a quorum. A total of 22 standing delegates were present. The moderator asked the standing delegates if they will work with one another during this setting of the association. All voted in peace.

- The Clerk read each of the following church letters: Franklin, Edinburgh, Friendship Decatur (Rodney), Great Hope, Indianapolis, Jewell Village, Mount Zion, Pleasant Valley, Salem, Shiloh and Union Laymon. A motion was made after the reading of each letter to accept it, print the necessary information in the minutes, and seat the delegate(s) present and those who may come in later. Each motion was seconded and passed. The delegates were recognized after each letter was read and were seated in fellowship by the moderator.
- The moderator called for new churches. There were none.
- The moderator asked all delegate, standing and lay delegates to stand and asked Rev. Homer Whited to ask God's blessing on this association.
- The appointment of the Divine Services Committee was then made. This committee consisted of Rev. Ed Tharpe (Chairman), Bro. Larry Burton, Sis. Barbara Floyd
- All visiting ministers and deacons were asked to stand to be recognized. The visitors included Rev. Danny Bailey, Rev. Terry Thrasher & Rev. Josh Polston all of the South Kentucky Association. Bro. Donnie then asked all other visitors to stand and be recognized. He then and welcomed and thanked them for their support.
- Bro. Donnie called for an offering (designated to go to the kitchen

committee) be taken up. Bro. Jimmie McGaha asked the blessing on the offering which amounted to \$280.00. The congregation sang *"Love Lifted Me.* 

The moderator then spoke of the tragedy of 911 mentioning he remembers that day and where he was when he heard of the attacks. 2,996 people perished in the attacks. Bro. Donnie mentioned those who attacked us are still looking to attack us today. He mentioned those who hate us so much have souls that need to be saved. We stood for a moment of silence in memory of the tragedy of September 11, 2001. Bro. Roger Sink led a prayer for active service personnel and their families.

Bro. Donnie encouraged us all to vote in November stating it is our duty as Christians to vote. He then asked Rev. Nathan Hunter to come forward and deliver the introductory sermon. Bro. Nathan greeted everyone and asked for the prayers of those in attendance.

Bro. Nathan read Matthew 5:1-16. He asked Rev. Danny Bailey to ask the blessing on the sermon. Bro. Nathan mentioned we are here to do God's bidding in business and in spirit. Stating we need to be humble stewards. We need to be working together to bring glory to the Lord. The world continues to get worse but that isn't an excuse to let up on witnessing. It should motivate us more. We should seek the Lord for guidance to witness to those of the world. Our reward is in heaven so while we are here on earth we need to be laboring for the Lord. Read and study the Word of God. The Christian life is a great life. We should share the blessing of this walk to those around us so they may desire to have the same blessing. Be merciful to those who do not know this blessed walk. Keep your heart pure which is a requirement to see God. Have we done all we can? We need to be children of God seeking after peace. It has been another busy year for the trustees. We want to thank everyone for their help and support because without everyone working together we would not be able to accomplish the things that are necessary to maintain the association campgrounds. We want to mention several folks and please except our apology if we miss someone. First of all we want to thank Bro's Donald Wiggington and Jim Tucker for cutting the grass for the past several years. The maintaining of the yard has been contracted to Jim Maulden and his wife for \$100 each time they mow. We also want to thank Bro George Lewis for maintaining the flowers and to David Brant for donating his time and expertise and his quick responses to the HVAC system.

We would like to thank everyone that helped us get ready for Youth Camp again this year. Due to the good turnout we were able to get all the athletic equipment set up and the Tabernacle and dining areas ready in no time at all. Just as important, was the help taking down and put away all the equipment at the close of Youth Camp. We also want to thank Bro's Daniel Sink, Andy Cline and Lucas Cline for helping put up tables and chairs in preparation for cleaning the carpet in the dining area.

The trustees met prior to each scheduled meeting or event in order to clean and maintain the building and premises. We wish to thank the wives who came and cleaned the bathrooms and assisted in various items that require a woman's touch.

As we stated in last year's trustee report; Bro Jim Stump pastor of the East Columbus church stating that due to the lack of attendance they were going to close the church. This is a very difficult time not only for Bro Stump and the trustees but everyone throughout the association. The E. Columbus church and property was deeded to the association and after much discussion and praver the (trustees) felt it was in the best interest of all involved to sell the church and property. The church was organized in the 1954; deeded to CIA 1962. We really didn't know how to approach this; contact a realtor, maybe see if someone would be interested in using or renting the building for church services. We were contacted by the company located next to the church (Touchdown Machine) that they would be interested in the building. With several businesses located around the church we felt selling the building to a local company would be in the best interest of all concerned. We contacted Matt Stephenson at RPE/Cobb & Associates for appraisal of the property. The appraisal came back at \$80,000. We contacted Touchdown Machine ask if they were still interested in the property; they were interested. We made several offers back and forth and finally settled on a selling price of \$90,000. Note; Touchdown Machine obtained an appraisal as well in the amount of \$85,000. We closed on the building and property on February 26, 2016. After paying for the title work we gave \$89,425 to the associational treasurer for deposit. We now had the responsibility of clearing out the building. We contacted all the churches in the association stating that on a given Saturday the trustees would be at the building and if anyone wanted any furniture or other supplies to feel free to come by and get what's available. Bro Kentlin Floyd took some of the pews and the pulpit for use in the Friendship Separate Baptist church. Other folks were interested in one or two pews and various other items. We found one person that was willing to take

the remaining pews. The remaining furniture and supplies were dispersed and we turned the keys over to the new owners on March 26, 2016. Bro Stump told the trustees that there was \$5929.33 left in the church treasurer and they were going to send that amount to the SBMI Treasurer requesting the money be used for the Ivory Coast Mission work, as Bro Jerry Ridge deems necessary.

Once again let me state this has been another great and busy year, we can't thank everyone enough for their help and support in this process.

The trustees were contacted by Bro Anthony Wiggington on August 31, 2016 that he was resigning as trustee for the final year of his term. The trustees voted to accept Bro Anthony's resignation.

The board of trustees met Saturday morning, September 10, 2016 and elected Michael Hardwick for one year to finish Bro Anthony Wiggington's term. We also elected Rick Owensby to a five year term as trustee replacing Bro. Roger Sink.

In January 2016, Brothers Jerry Ridge & Ed Tharpe made the trip to the Ivory Coast. They enjoyed great fellowship with the elders and a wonderful spirit of unity. The Elders expressed their appreciation that once again our missionaries were willing to come. Bro Jerry also discussed bringing a group of young people from the USA to hold vacation bible school in the villages sometime in July. This was met with great enthusiasm. Bro Jerry and Bro Ed visited several of the churches and evangelized. They also had the opportunity to work on the mission house.

On March 26th, 2016 the board met at the Okolona Separate Baptist Church in Louisville KY to discuss the success of the January trip. Everyone who had interest in making the trip in July were encouraged to come in order to get an understanding of the work and the plans for the trip.

On April 9, 2016 the mission board met during the annual ministers and deacons conference held at the Nolynn Campground. We discussed in greater detail the July trip as well as Bro Randy Brown's work in Haiti and home missions.

Bro Jerry held a retreat at the Nolynn Campground over Memorial Day weekend, May 27, 28, & 29<sup>th</sup>, for everyone who had signed up to make the July trip to the Ivory Coast. The turnout was great and others also came in a show of support. They had great fellowship, practiced songs and skits. They met several of the Christians and attended services at the Abidjan Church. They held VBS type classes in six villages. This was well received and we consider it a great success. The Christians of the Ivory Coast accompanied and assisted our missionaries in every village. The VBS was not a work of the USA missionaries but a combined effort with the Ivory Coast Churches. They arrived safely back in the USA on July 21<sup>st</sup>.

July 9<sup>th</sup> thru the 16<sup>th</sup>, Bro. Randy Brown took a team of 15 to Haiti and held summer camp for the youth. It was well attended was considered a great success. Plans are underway for another summer camp in July of 2017. Bro Randy is planning a return trip to Haiti in January 2017 with a surgical team.

We continue to encourage all of our churches to support the mission work of the SBMI. Both home and foreign missions are a vital part of the ministry. Your donations have allowed us to begin work on the mission house and your continued contribution will allow us to see it completed. As with the truck you purchased last year, this new dwelling will be a great tool for our missionaries while they are away from their families and doing the Lord's work.

Equally important is the work of home missions. While great work is being done in Africa and Haiti, we have much work to be done at home as well.

### ARTICLES OF DOCTRINE

1. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the infallible Word of God and the only safe rule of faith and practice, using the King James version of the Holy Bible. \* II Tim. 3:16-17; I Cor. 10:11; II Peter 1:20-21

2. That there is in the God-Head three divine personages; Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. I John 5:7; Matt. 28:19; Matt. 3:15-17

3. That man is in a fallen state before God, and is unable to liberate himself by any ability we possess by nature. Isa. 63:1-5; I Cor. 15:22; Ps. 51:5; John 14:6

4. That salvation, regeneration, justification, sanctification and redemption are through faith in the life, death, resurrection, ascension, and intercession of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. John 17:19; Acts 13:39; Titus 2:14; Rom. 3:24-26

5. We believe that he who endures to the end the same shall be saved. Rev. 2:10; Matt. 24:13

6. That the joys of the righteous and punishment of the wicked will be eternal. Matt. 25:46; Dan. 12:2; Rom. 5:21

7. We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordinances of Jesus Christ, appointed in the Church, and none but true believers are proper subjects, and the only proper mode of baptism is immersion of believers. #### **CONSTITUTION**

#### THE PREAMBLE

The name of this Association shall be called the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist in Christ, Incorporated, and we agree to be governed by the following Constitution:

### ARTICLE I

Section 1. This body shall be composed of lay delegates sent from different churches, and Ministers, Deacons and the Sunday School Superintendents from Sunday Schools of the churches comprising the body, if they are members of the Separate Baptist Church.

Section 2. Each church comprising the body of this Association shall be entitled to 2 lay delegates for the first 25 members or fraction thereof; one lay delegate for each additional 25 members or fraction thereof.

#### **ARTICLE II**

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall include the following: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer, who shall be elected and hold their office one associational year, and a Board of Trustees composed of five members selected by vote of delegates appointed by the churches; each church to be allowed one delegate. No church is to have more than one Association Trustee serving at one time. If a trustee is from your church he will automatically be the voting delegate when the new trustee is to be elected. The Chairman of the Trustees will preside over the meeting. Members of the first Board of Trustees shall serve 1,2,3,4 and 5 years respectively. Thereafter, each member shall be elected for five years, one members term of office to expire at each annual session.

Section 2. The duties of the Moderator shall be to preside at all meetings, be it either business or divine worship, and to appoint all committees except the Constitutional Committee, and to cast the deciding vote in case of a tie.

Section 3. The Assistant Moderator shall perform all duties of the Moderator in the absence of the Moderator.

Section 4. The duties of the Clerk shall be to make complete written record of the proceedings of all meetings of this body and keep a file record of the same, and carry on all correspondence.

Section 5. The duties of the Assistant Clerk shall be to perform the duties of the Clerk in the absence of the Clerk.

Section 6. The duties of the Treasurer shall be to receive all money and pay out the same upon order of the Trustees.

Section 7. The duties of the Assistant Treasurer shall be to perform the duties of the Treasurer in case the Treasurer is not able to perform his duties or is deceased.

Section 8. The duties of the Board of Trustees shall be to decide all questions arising under the constitution and by-laws of the association and to have the responsibility of the care and upkeep of all associational properties.

#### ARTICLE III

This body shall meet once each year (or more often) if called by the Moderator.

#### ARTICLE IV

No delegate shall absent himself from this body while in session without permission from the Moderator.

### ARTICLE V

No person has the right to perform the Ordinance of God's House unless legally ordained according to the mode adopted by the Separate Baptist Association.

#### ARTICLE VI

Section 1. This association shall have a Mission Board consisting of five members. The members of this Board, shall be appointed by the Moderator.

Sections 2. The duties of the Mission Board shall be to solicit the support of our churches and ministers, and to organize new churches and Sunday Schools. The churches of the association shall raise a fund necessary for this. The Mission Board shall solicit each church for support.

Section 3. The duties of the Mission Board shall be also to take care of any mission money sent in by the different churches.

### ARTICLE VII

Section 1. This body shall have a Presbytery composed of five ordained ministers appointed by the moderator.

Section 2. The duties of the Presbytery shall be to attend the examination and ordination of all candidates for the ministry and deacons in the churches.

Section 3. If any church of this association wishes to ordain a deacon, they shall notify the Presbytery by letter, not less than three members of the Presbytery shall be present to examine the candidate and if found worthy to set apart or ordain. The Presbytery then may, if needed, ask any ordained personnel of this association to assist in the ordination only at which time the candidate shall be given a certificate of ordination.

Section 4. The qualifications required of those seeking ordination to the ministry are set forth in the by-laws of this association. The duties of the board shall extend from one session to another, and said board shall make a report at each meeting.

#### ARTICLE VIII

This association shall have a Young Peoples Department, to be known as the Young Peoples Separate Baptist Union. Its officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. It will include all the Young Peoples Separate Baptist Unions of the association and will hold at least one meeting a year for the purpose of promoting the Young Peoples Work. Other meetings may be held upon call by the President. All officers shall be elected at the regular annual meeting. The Union may draft its own bylaws, but no by-laws shall be accepted which will conflict with or be in disagreement with the belief of the Separate Baptist Church. Said Young Peoples Separate Baptist Union shall make a report at each association.

#### ARTICLE IX

This constitution, By-Laws and Articles of Doctrine may be changed or amended by a two-thirds vote of the association after an amendment has been submitted by a committee selected by the association for that purpose and after having been tabled for a period of one associational year. All amendments shall be submitted to the committee before being voted upon by the association. Said committee shall be composed of three members elected by the associational delegates. Members of the first Constitutional Committee shall serve one, two, three years respectively. Thereafter, each member shall be elected for three years, one members' term of office to expire at each annual association.

## BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE I

Any church applying for membership in this body by letter or delegate shall be requested to give evidence of orthodoxy and agree to comply with the rules of this body before being received.

#### ARTICLE II

When any minister seeks membership in this body, or licentiate seeks ordination, his church shall notify the Presbytery by letter, the Presbytery shall be appointed at each association. Not less than three members of the Presbytery shall be present to examine him on his faith and doctrine, his standing in the church to which he belongs, his ability to expound the Gospel, and his educational qualifications. Any minister shall be licensed for two years before being set apart or ordained by the Presbytery. Then if found in complete accord with the association's Article of Doctrine, able to intelligently expound the Gospel, and worthy, then the Presbytery may if needed ask any ordained personnel of this association to assist in ordination only.

#### ARTICLE III

Should any church or any member minister of this body fail to report to this body, the Presbytery shall investigate the cause of such failure and report the same to the association.

If any minister fails to report to the association or fails to pick up his minister's card within 2 years, they shall be placed on file with the association papers.

#### ARTICLE IV

When more than one candidate is nominated for any office in the association, the election shall be by ballot.

#### ARTICLE V

This body shall have the power to expel any church, minister, deacon, pastor or member from membership in the body for heterodoxy and disorderly conduct, and shall demand the surrender of credentials to the association. No church shall employ a minister as pastor who is not identified with the Separate Baptist Church, except in case of shortage of ministers, and then only by and with the consent and approval of the Presbytery. Said ministers so employed shall sign an agreement that their preaching shall be in accord with the Articles of Doctrine adopted by this body during his pastorate. The Separate Baptist Church is opposed to the doctrine of sanctification as a second definite work of grace and a thousand years literal reign of Christ, and will not permit its being preached in its churches.

### ARTICLE VI

In case of a discussion with any church of this body, and inability of the members of such church to settle such discussion, any member of such church shall have the privilege of calling upon the Board of Trustees of this body, and not upon the association, for settlement, upon giving due notice to the church of said appeal from the decision of such church to said board. The board shall take such action as it shall see fit and necessary in the case. Any member or church, if dissatisfied with the decision and action of the board, may appeal the decision of said board to the association.

### ARTICLE VII

It shall be the duty of the moderator of each church body to remind the church body to support the Central Indiana Association and Mission Board with their financial aid.

### ARTICLE VIII

The clerk shall receive two hundred dollars annually for his/her services as clerk and shall draw on the treasury to defray expenses in the printing and distribution of the minutes of the association.

## ARTICLE IX

No officer of this association shall hold the same office more than five years in succession.

### ARTICLE X

All elected and appointed officers of this association shall serve the time for which they are elected and until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

### ARTICLE XI

This association may act prudently as protectorate for a limited time toward any church of this association which fails to have any meetings.

### ARTICLE XII

This association shall not issue minister cards to licentiate ministers.

### ARTICLE XIII

This association forbids the ordination of women as ministers of this body.

### ARTICLE XIV

This association prohibits the ordination of homosexuals as ministers or deacons of this body, Also, no person shall be ordained who has more than one living wife or whose wife has more than one living husband.

### ARTICLE XV

This association defines a man as one who, at birth, is a biological man. A woman is defined as one who, at birth, is a biological woman. Furthermore, using the above definitions, this association defines "holy matrimony" as the marriage between one man and one woman.

Finally, using all the definitions above, this association forbids

- Any member minister from participating, in any manner, in a marriage ceremony other than holy matrimony.
- Any member church or associational properties being used in any marriage ceremony other than holy matrimony.

## **RULES OF PROCEDURE**

- 1. This association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. All officers of this association shall be elected by a majority vote of delegates present. No one shall be allowed to vote by proxy.
- 3. All nominations of officers shall be by delegates.
- 4. Only members who presented the motion under discussion may speak more than once upon the motion, except when he be given permission by the moderator.
- 5. Any member wishing to speak shall arise and address the moderator and when given permission to speak, must adhere strictly to the subject without casting any reflections upon any previous speaker.
- 6. No person shall be interrupted when speaking as long as he adheres to the rules and decorum of the association and is casting light upon the subject.
- 7. Any delegate shall have a right to rise to a point of order any time one speaking is thought out of order by the objector. When recognized by the moderator, the objector may state his point of order. The moderator's decision on the point of order shall be final, unless appealed to the body.
- 8. Creating disturbances, speaking harshly to a brother, sowing discord, talking off the subject under discussion, or any act creating disturbances, shall be considered out of order.
- 9. There must be at least twenty delegates present to constitute a quorum.
- 10. All grievances or complaints that come before the association shall be heard by a committee appointed by the moderator and approved by association. Said committee shall immediately hear the evidence on the complaint or grievance and immediately report their decision to the association. Said decision shall be final unless an appeal is taken to the association.
- 11. Where these rules fail to provide, the moderator shall be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order."
- 12. These rules may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present at the regular association.

## **RULES & GUIDELINES FOR YOUTH CAMP**

Last revised September 10, 2004

- 1. No Camper shall be permitted to leave the campgrounds without the permission of the committee.
- 2. All campers must stay out of the woods and stay on the playground.
- 3. Each camper will be under the supervision of his or her teacher.
- 4. There will be no smoking while at the campground.
- 5. All girls must wear dresses or skirts to a length no higher than the knees.
- 6. Slacks will not be permitted for girls.
- 7. Boys must wear sleeved shirts and long pants.
- 8. Shorts will not be permitted for any camper.

#### MINISTERS AND DEACONS INSTITUTE CONSTITUTION

#### PREAMBLE

The name of this association shall be the Ministers and Deacons Institute of Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptists in Christ.

#### Article I

This body shall be composed of all pastors, licentiate/ordained ministers and ordained deacons of the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist Churches.

#### Article II

Section 1. The officers of this body shall be a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, Secretary/Treasurer and Assistant Secretary/Treasurer, who shall be elected and shall hold this office one year.

Section 2. No member shall be allowed to serve in the same office more than two consecutive years.

Section 3. All committees shall be appointed by the chairman.

Section 4. The Secretary/Treasurer shall make a complete written record of each meeting and keep on file, carry on all correspondence, and keep a record of receipts and expenditures.

### Article III

This body shall meet on the third Friday night before the Fifth Sunday Meeting @ 7:00 p.m.

#### Article IV

Section 1. This institute shall have a program committee of two members of the Institute.

Section 2. The committee will have the responsibility of providing a program that will be acceptable to the chairman and pastor of the host church.

#### Article V

No one shall be eligible to make motions or speak in the business meeting except pastors, licentiate/ordained ministers or ordained deacons of the Central Indiana Separate Baptist Churches.

### YOUNG PEOPLE'S SEPARATE BAPTIST UNION BY-LAWS JULY 14, 1991

- **1**. The purpose of YPSBU is to gather the Central Indiana Association Young People together for worship and fellowship and to encourage young people to attend church and to be Christians.
- 2. The YPSBU will have quarterly meetings to be held in accordance with YPSBU President.
- **3**. Officers for the YPSBU will be elected annually at the second quarterly meeting.
- 4. No officer is to hold the same office for more than three (3) consecutive years.
- 5. Officers for YPSBU will be as follows:

President - conducts quarterly meetings and appoints committee.

- <u>Vice-President</u> assist President; hold the position of President in the absence of the President.
- <u>Secretary and Treasurer</u> record minutes of meetings; control bank account; handle any correspondence.
- <u>Assistant Secretary and Treasurer</u> assist Secretary and Treasurer; hold office in their absence.

Song Leader - lead congregational singing at YPSBU quarterly meetings.

Assistant Song Leader - assist Song Leader; hold office of Song Leader in their absence.

- **6**. Each quarterly YPSBU meeting will have a program for Young People especially designed by a program committee.
- **7**. There will be a program committee of three members (or one church) appointed by the President at each quarterly meeting. They will be responsible for the following quarterly program.
- **8**. Young People from the ages 10-45 will be eligible to vote in business if they attend one of the Central Indiana Association Churches.
- **9**. The by-laws can be amended by two-thirds majority vote at the YPSBU quarterly meeting.
