2019 MINUTES FRIDAY MORNING

The one hundred and fiftieth annual session of the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist in Christ, Inc. convened at the Central Indiana Campground on Friday, September 6th, 2019 at 10:00 AM Eastern Daylight Savings Time. The moderator, Rev. Rick Owensby asked everyone to stand and assistant moderator Bro. Jimmie McGaha led in prayer. Bro. Rick welcomed everyone to this setting of the association. He then asked Bro. Allen Wiggington to lead the congregation in singing. Bro. Allen led *“Leaning on the Everlasting Arms”* while Sis. Mary Ann Sink played the piano, Rev. Jimmy Polston played the guitar and Bro. Nick Popplewell ran the sound system.

The moderator asked Bro. Roger Sink to come forward to lead the devotional service. Bro. Roger welcomed everyone and praised the Lord to be able to attend the association. He spoke of how we all look forward to making it to Heaven and read a story about “what waits on the other side”. He then read Isaiah 55:1-2, Psalm 96:1-6, John 3:16-17. Bro. Roger then asked for an altar of prayer where many requests were made for sick folks and for the lost as well as several unspoken requests. We were led by Rev. Nick Whited.

The moderator led the congregation in the pledges to the American and Christian Flags, and the Holy Bible. The moderator asked that all standing delegates from the Central Indiana Association, which include all Ministers, Deacons, and Sunday School Superintendents, to stand to constitute a quorum. A total of 19 standing delegates were present. The moderator asked the standing delegates if they will work with one another during this setting of the association. All voted in peace.

- The Clerk read each of the following church letters: Franklin, Edinburgh, Friendship Decatur (Rodney), Great Hope, Indianapolis, Mount Zion, Pleasant Valley, Salem, Shiloh, Union Laymon and Jewell Village. A motion was made after the reading of each letter to accept it, print the necessary information in the minutes, and seat the delegate(s) present and those who may come in later (if delegates were listed). Each motion was seconded and passed.
- With unanimous consent Bro. Rick asked all standing delegates to stand and Rev. Homer Whited asked God’s blessing on this Association.
- The moderator called for new churches. There were none.
- The appointment of the Divine Services Committee was then made. This committee consisted of Rev. Nick Whited (Chairman), Sis. Kay Hunter, Sis. Robin Abbott.
- All visiting ministers and deacons were asked to stand to be recognized. The visitors included Rev. Danny Bailey and Rev. Terry Thrasher of the South Kentucky Association and Bro. Charles Jordan from the Nolynn Association. Bro. Rick also asked all visitors to stand and welcomed them all, which included Phyllis Cooper, Stacey Thrasher, Leah Thrasher and Michael Jordan. He thanked them all for their support.

- Bro. Rick called for an offering (designated to go to the kitchen committee) be taken up. Rev. Ed Tharpe asked the blessing on the offering which amounted to \$225.00. Bro. Benny Walden led the congregation in singing *"Oh How I Love Jesus"*.

Rev. Donnie Wiggington came forward to pray after observing a moment of silence for veterans and active service personnel and their families.

Bro. Roger Sink then came forward with encouraging words concerning our active service personnel and their families and said a prayer.

Bro. Rick then asked Rev. Lonzo Wiggington to come forward and deliver the introductory sermon.

Bro. Lonzo asked for prayer as he delivered this morning's sermon. He read Malachi 3:1-6 and later read Ephesians 2:1-5. He spoke of how we need *ask for the old paths, where is the good way, and walk therein, and ye shall find rest for your souls*. He told how people need to realize they are lost and need the Lord to take away their sins. As we need breath to live in this world, Christians must also have the spirit to live for God. We need to be serving God as Christians and using the altar in our services. He's concerned that we have more complaining than prayer in church now-a-days. If we've truly been quickened, meaning made alive, then we must be active in our churches. Every Christian must read the Bible. Less TV and more Bible would help all of us. We need to *come out from among them and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing*. You cannot go to Heaven if you die with sin in your life, so get right and live right so you can die right. We may think "I don't know why God isn't blessing us", but God isn't cheating anyone. If we'll serve him and do what he wants, he will bless us, and people can shout and praise the Lord.

- Bro. Rick asked that the Divine Services committee report be read. Friday afternoon devotion – Rev. Nathan Hunter or Bro. Jimmie McGaha as alternate, Friday evening devotion – Rev. Donnie Wiggington or Bro. Charles Jordan as alternate. Friday evening sermon - Rev. Terry Thrasher or Rev. Danny Bailey as alternate. Saturday morning devotions - Bro. Benny Walden or Rev. Matt Satter as alternate. Saturday Morning Sermon - Rev. Johnny Perkins or Rev. Jimmy Polston as alternate. Saturday afternoon devotion – Rev. Homer Whited or Bro. Allen Wiggington as alternate. Bro. Charles mentioned he could not serve. A motion was made and seconded to accept this report leaving open the one alternate position. The motion carried.

Bro. Rick called for songs so Bro. Allen Wiggington came and led us in singing *"I'll Fly Away"* and *"There shall be Showers of Blessing"* as we had a handshake fellowship with Rev. Lonzo Wiggington.

Bro. Rick asked Rev. Jimmy Polston to pray the blessing on the noon meal.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

The delegates were asked to stand and be recognized.

- The Ministers and Deacons Institute report was read. A motion was made to accept the report, send the financials to the auditing committee and print it in the minutes. Motion was seconded and carried.
- The report of the Fifth Sunday Meeting report was read. A motion was made and properly supported to accept the report, refer the financial portion to the Auditing Committee and print it in the minutes. The motion carried.
- The report of the Separate Baptist Missions Incorporated representative was

read by the clerk. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report and print it in the minutes. The motion passed.

Rev. Nathan Hunter asked a blessing on the public offering. Bro. Danny Swanson led us in singing *"What a Day that Will Be"*. The general offering totaled \$163.00.

The moderator asked Rev. Jerry Ridge to come forward to preach the Mission Sermon. Bro. Jerry asked everyone to whisper a prayer for the message. He told us the Lord will use all of us, and that our whole life is a mission work.

Bro. Jerry started by mentioning 1 Samuel 15 and told of how Saul went from being little in his own eyes (humble) to doing what he thought was pretty good (proud) but was against the will of God. He told how Saul was told to go utterly destroy the Amalekites because God was judging them and to spare no one, but the people kept the sheep and oxen and even the King, all against God's will. *Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice* (vs. 22) He also told of Elijah who thought he was the last person around serving the Lord, but God reminded him *Yet I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and every mouth which hath not kissed him.* (1 Kings 19:18). The Kitchen Committee report, Camp Meeting Committee & Sunday School Convention reports were read. Motion was made to accept the reports, refer the financial portion to the auditing committee and print them in the minutes. Motions carried.

The moderator then recognized the Kitchen Committee for their work and care of the wonderful meals we enjoy at Associational meetings by having the delegation applaud them.

Bro. Rick also named the Kitchen Committee for the next year: Sis. Kim Wiggington, Chairperson, Sis. Sheila Cook, Sis. Carla Tharpe, Sis. Jessica Popplewell & Rev. John Perkins Jr.

Ministry and Doctrine report was read with a motion to accept the report and print it in the minutes. Motion carried.

Camp Meeting Committee report was read. Motion was made to accept the report, refer financial portion to auditing committee. Motion carried. The moderator then read the appointment for the 2020 Committee by the moderator. They are Chairman- Bro. Allen Wiggington, Bro. Benny Walden and Rev. Matt Satter.

Youth Camp report was read. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report, refer the financial portion to the Auditing committee and print it in the minutes. The motion passed.

The Moderator then appointed the Youth Camp Committee for 2020: Chairman Bro. Stacy Wiggington, Rev. Matt Satter, Sis. Kentrina Freeman, Sis. Morgan Sink & Bro. Roger Sink.

2019 SBMI REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

The SBMI board met on September 7, 2018 during the Central Indiana Association held at the Midway Campground. We discussed the ongoing mission work in the Ivory Coast, including the work to complete the mission house, as well as the work in Haiti.

The board met on Friday, October 11, 2018 during the annual General Association held at the Nolynn Association Campground in Magnolia, Kentucky. Discussions included the home and foreign missions' finances, the continuing work to put the final touches on the mission house, as well as the continuing expenses (electric and water bills, and general maintenance). We discussed the well drilling equipment and its use in the Ivory Coast. Rev Randy Brown updated the board on the work in Haiti and Rev Jerry Ridge gave an update on the work in the Ivory Coast. We also discussed the addition of an Assistant Treasurer for the mission board.

The mission board met again on April 13, 2019 during the annual ministers and deacons conference held at the Nolynn Association Campground. We discussed Rev Jerry Ridge's return to the Ivory Coast possibly in July at which time he will talk to the villages and set up a schedule for the intended trip in October for the bible classes. He will also determine which villages are most in need of a water well. The intent is to drill the well during the day and evangelize in the evening.

We also discussed the possibility that if a church wished to sponsor the drilling of a well for a village, the cost would be approximately \$4,000 to \$4,500. This includes the casing, pump, wiring, etc.

At this time the drilling equipment has not been shipped to the Ivory Coast due to red tape, but the efforts are ongoing.

The board met on June 8, 2019 at the Okolona Separate Baptist Church in Louisville, KY to discuss Bro Jerry's upcoming trip to the Ivory Coast and the efforts to ship the drilling equipment.

Rev Jerry traveled to the Ivory Coast from June 25th to July 16th and visited with

the Christians and villages. As well as evangelized as much as possible.

Rev Randy Brown has been advised of an opportunity to feed children in Haiti. While we no longer have access to the school in Ouanaminthe, there is an orphanage called God's Littlest Angels that is in much need of funds to feed the children that live there. The funds that were designated to feed the children of Haiti will be used for this new outreach.

During the past year the Mission Board was able to provide financial assistance to:

- Rev John Perkins & Rev Craig Bell with a grant to assist with advertising and rental of locations to hold services for the revival across Indiana. The intent is to preach in every county over the next 2 years.
- Bro Corbin Burton participated in a mission trip to Colorado and money that was designated for his trip was sent through the SBMI.
- We also assisted the Bethel Church of the Christian Unity Association with a grant in order to put a drop-down ceiling in their sanctuary.

The mission board encourages all our churches to continue to support home and foreign missions with their labor, prayers and finances. This is the great commission given to us by Christ himself.

ARTICLES OF DOCTRINE

1. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the infallible Word of God and the only safe rule of faith and practice, using the King James version of the Holy Bible. * II Tim. 3:16-17; I Cor. 10:11; II Peter 1:20-21

2. That there is in the God-Head three divine personages; Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. I John 5:7; Matt. 28:19; Matt. 3:15-17

3. That man is in a fallen state before God, and is unable to liberate himself by any ability we possess by nature. Isa. 63:1-5; I Cor. 15:22; Ps. 51:5; John 14:6

4. That salvation, regeneration, justification, sanctification and redemption are through faith in the life, death, resurrection, ascension, and intercession of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. John 17:19; Acts 13:39; Titus 2:14; Rom. 3:24-26

5. We believe that he who endures to the end the same shall be saved. Rev. 2:10; Matt. 24:13

6. That the joys of the righteous and punishment of the wicked will be eternal. Matt. 25:46; Dan. 12:2; Rom. 5:21

7. We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordinances of Jesus Christ, appointed in the Church, and none but true believers are proper subjects, and the only proper mode of baptism is immersion of believers. Matt. 28:19-20; Acts 2:41; John 13:14; I Peter 3:21; Matt. 3:14; I Cor. 11:23-26

8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week or Lord's Day, which ought to be observed and spent in public or private worship of God and that we should abstain from worldly concerns except in cases of necessity or mercy. Acts 20:7; I Cor. 16:2

9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both of the just and the unjust, but every man to his own order. 11. We believe that Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for everyone, and that all may partake of his Divine benefits through repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. CONSTITUTION

THE PREAMBLE

The name of this Association shall be called the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist in Christ, Incorporated, and we agree to be governed by the following Constitution:

ARTICLE I

Section 1. This body shall be composed of lay delegates sent from different churches, and Ministers, Deacons and the Sunday School Superintendents from Sunday Schools of the churches comprising the body, if they are members of the Separate Baptist Church.

Section 2. Each church comprising the body of this Association shall be entitled to 2 lay delegates for the first 25 members or fraction thereof; one lay delegate for each additional 25 members or fraction thereof.

ARTICLE II

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall include the following: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer, who shall be elected and hold their office one associational year, and a Board of Trustees composed of five members selected by vote of delegates appointed by the churches; each church to be allowed one delegate. No church is to have more than one Association Trustee serving at one time. If a trustee is from your church he will automatically be the voting delegate when the new trustee is to be elected. The Chairman of the Trustees will preside over the meeting. Members of the first Board of Trustees shall serve 1,2,3,4 and 5 years respectively. Thereafter, each member shall be elected for five years, one members term of office to expire at each annual session.

Section 2. The duties of the Moderator shall be to preside at all meetings, be it either business or divine worship, and to appoint all committees except the Constitutional Committee, and to cast the deciding vote in case of a tie.

Section 3. The Assistant Moderator shall perform all duties of the Moderator in the absence of the Moderator.

Section 4. The duties of the Clerk shall be to make complete written record of the proceedings of all meetings of this body and keep a file record of the same, and carry on all correspondence.

Section 5. The duties of the Assistant Clerk shall be to perform the duties of the Clerk in the absence of the Clerk.

Section 6. The duties of the Treasurer shall be to receive all money and pay out the same upon order of the Trustees.

Section 7. The duties of the Assistant Treasurer shall be to perform the duties of the Treasurer in case the Treasurer is not able to perform his duties or is deceased.

Section 8. The duties of the Board of Trustees shall be to decide all questions arising under the constitution and by-laws of the association and to have the responsibility of the care and upkeep of all associational properties.

ARTICLE III

This body shall meet once each year (or more often) if called by the Moderator.

ARTICLE IV

No delegate shall absent himself from this body while in session without permission from the Moderator.

ARTICLE V

No person has the right to perform the Ordinance of God's House unless legally ordained according to the mode adopted by the Separate Baptist Association.

ARTICLE VI

Section 1. This association shall have a Mission Board consisting of five members. The members of this Board, shall be appointed by the Moderator.

Sections 2. The duties of the Mission Board shall be to solicit the support of our churches and ministers, and to organize new churches and Sunday Schools. The churches of the association shall raise a fund necessary for this. The Mission Board shall solicit each church for support.

Section 3. The duties of the Mission Board shall be also to take care of any mission money sent in by the different churches.

ARTICLE VII

Section 1. This body shall have a Presbytery composed of five ordained ministers appointed by the moderator.

Section 2. The duties of the Presbytery shall be to attend the examination and ordination of all candidates for the ministry and deacons in the churches.

Section 3. If any church of this association wishes to ordain a deacon, they shall notify the Presbytery by letter, not less than three members of the Presbytery shall be present to examine the candidate and if found worthy to set apart or ordain. The Presbytery then may, if needed, ask any ordained personnel of this association to assist in the ordination only at which time the candidate shall be given a certificate of ordination.

Section 4. The qualifications required of those seeking ordination to the ministry are set forth in the by-laws of this association. The duties of the board shall extend from one session to another, and said board shall make a report at each meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

This association shall have a Young Peoples Department, to be known as the Young Peoples Separate Baptist Union. Its officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. It will include all the Young Peoples Separate Baptist Unions of the association and will hold at least one meeting a year for the purpose of promoting the Young Peoples Work. Other meetings may be held upon call by the President. All officers shall be elected at the regular annual meeting. The Union may draft its own by-laws, but no by-laws shall be accepted which will conflict with or be in disagreement with the belief of the Separate Baptist Church. Said Young Peoples Separate Baptist Union shall make a report at each association.

ARTICLE IX

This constitution, By-Laws and Articles of Doctrine may be changed or amended by a two-thirds vote of the association after an amendment has been submitted by a committee selected by the association for that purpose and after having been tabled for a period of one associational year. All amendments shall be submitted to the committee before being voted upon by the association. Said committee shall be composed of three members elected by the associational delegates. Members of the first Constitutional Committee shall serve one, two, three years respectively. Thereafter, each member shall be elected for three years, one members' term of office to expire at each annual association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

Any church applying for membership in this body by letter or delegate shall be requested to give evidence of orthodoxy and agree to comply with the rules of this body before being received.

ARTICLE II

When any minister seeks membership in this body, or licentiate seeks ordination, his church shall notify the Presbytery by letter, the Presbytery shall be appointed at each association. Not less than three members of the Presbytery shall be present to examine him on his faith and doctrine, his standing in the church to which he belongs, his ability to expound the Gospel, and his educational qualifications. Any minister shall be licensed for two years before being set apart or ordained by the Presbytery. Then if found in complete accord with the association's Article of Doctrine, able to intelligently expound the Gospel, and worthy, then the Presbytery may if needed ask any ordained personnel of this association to assist in ordination only.

ARTICLE III

Should any church or any member minister of this body fail to report to this body, the Presbytery shall investigate the cause of such failure and report the same to the association.

If any minister fails to report to the association or fails to pick up his minister's card within 2 years, they shall be placed on file with the association papers.

ARTICLE IV

When more than one candidate is nominated for any office in the association, the election shall be by ballot.

ARTICLE V

This body shall have the power to expel any church, minister, deacon, pastor or member from membership in the body for heterodoxy and disorderly conduct, and shall demand the surrender of credentials to the association. No church shall employ a minister as pastor who is not identified with the Separate Baptist Church, except in case of shortage of ministers, and then only by and with the consent and approval of the Presbytery. Said ministers so employed shall sign an agreement that their preaching shall be in accord with the Articles of Doctrine adopted by this body during his pastorate. The Separate Baptist Church is opposed to the doctrine of sanctification as a second definite work of grace and a thousand years literal reign of Christ, and will not permit its being preached in its churches.

ARTICLE VI

In case of a discussion with any church of this body, and inability of the members of such church to settle such discussion, any member of such church shall have the privilege of calling upon the Board of Trustees of this body, and not upon the association, for settlement, upon giving due notice to the church of said appeal from the decision of such church to said board. The board shall take such action as it shall see fit and necessary in the case. Any member or church, if dissatisfied with the decision and action of the board, may appeal the decision of said board to the association.

ARTICLE VII

It shall be the duty of the moderator of each church body to remind the church body to support the Central Indiana Association and Mission Board with their financial aid.

ARTICLE VIII

The clerk shall receive two hundred dollars annually for his/her services as clerk and shall draw on the treasury to defray expenses in the printing and distribution of the minutes of the association.

ARTICLE IX

No officer of this association shall hold the same office more than five years in succession.

ARTICLE X

All elected and appointed officers of this association shall serve the time for which they are elected and until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

ARTICLE XI

This association may act prudently as protectorate for a limited time toward any church of this association which fails to have any meetings.

ARTICLE XII

This association shall not issue minister cards to licentiate ministers.

ARTICLE XIII

This association forbids the ordination of women as ministers of this body.

ARTICLE XIV

This association prohibits the ordination of homosexuals as ministers or deacons of this body. Also, no person shall be ordained who has more than one living wife or whose wife has more than one living husband.

ARTICLE XV

This association defines a man as one who, at birth, is a biological man. A woman is defined as one who, at birth, is a biological woman. Furthermore, using the above definitions, this association defines “holy matrimony” as the marriage between one man and one woman.

Finally, using all the definitions above, this association forbids

- Any member minister from participating, in any manner, in a marriage ceremony other than holy matrimony.
- Any member church or associational properties being used in any marriage ceremony other than holy matrimony.

RULES OF PROCEDURE

1. This association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. All officers of this association shall be elected by a majority vote of delegates present. No one shall be allowed to vote by proxy.
3. All nominations of officers shall be by delegates.
4. Only members who presented the motion under discussion may speak more than once upon the motion, except when he be given permission by the moderator.
5. Any member wishing to speak shall arise and address the moderator and when given permission to speak, must adhere strictly to the subject without casting any reflections upon any previous speaker.
6. No person shall be interrupted when speaking as long as he adheres to the rules and decorum of the association and is casting light upon the subject.
7. Any delegate shall have a right to rise to a point of order any time one speaking is thought out of order by the objector. When recognized by the moderator, the objector may state his point of order. The moderator’s decision on the point of order shall be final, unless appealed to the body.
8. Creating disturbances, speaking harshly to a brother, sowing discord, talking off the subject under discussion, or any act creating disturbances, shall be considered out of order.
9. There must be at least ten delegates present to constitute a quorum.

10. All grievances or complaints that come before the association shall be heard by a committee appointed by the moderator and approved by association. Said committee shall immediately hear the evidence on the complaint or grievance and immediately report their decision to the association. Said decision shall be final unless an appeal is taken to the association.
11. Where these rules fail to provide, the moderator shall be governed by “Robert’s Rules of Order.”
12. These rules may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present at the regular association.

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR YOUTH CAMP

Last revised September 10, 2004

1. No Camper shall be permitted to leave the campgrounds without the permission of the committee.
2. All campers must stay out of the woods and stay on the playground.
3. Each camper will be under the supervision of his or her teacher.
4. There will be no smoking while at the campground.
5. All girls must wear dresses or skirts to a length no higher than the knees.
6. Slacks will not be permitted for girls.
7. Boys must wear sleeved shirts and long pants.
8. Shorts will not be permitted for any camper.

MINISTERS AND DEACONS INSTITUTE CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

The name of this association shall be the Ministers and Deacons Institute of Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptists in Christ.

Article I

This body shall be composed of all pastors, licentiate/ordained ministers and ordained deacons of the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist Churches.

Article II

Section 1. The officers of this body shall be a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, Secretary/Treasurer and Assistant Secretary/Treasurer, who shall be elected and shall hold this office one year.

Section 2. No member shall be allowed to serve in the same office more than two consecutive years.

Section 3. All committees shall be appointed by the chairman.

Section 4. The Secretary/Treasurer shall make a complete written record of each meeting and keep on file, carry on all correspondence, and keep a record of receipts and expenditures.

Article III

This body shall meet on the third Friday night before the Fifth Sunday Meeting @ 7:00 p.m.

Article IV

Section 1. This institute shall have a program committee of two members of the Institute.

Section 2. The committee will have the responsibility of providing a program that will be acceptable to the chairman and pastor of the host church.

Article V

No one shall be eligible to make motions or speak in the business meeting except pastors, licentiate/ordained ministers or ordained deacons of the Central Indiana Separate Baptist Churches.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S SEPARATE BAPTIST UNION BY-LAWS **JULY 14, 1991**

1. The purpose of YPSBU is to gather the Central Indiana Association Young People together for worship and fellowship and to encourage young people to attend church and to be Christians.
2. The YPSBU will have quarterly meetings to be held in accordance with YPSBU President.
3. Officers for the YPSBU will be elected annually at the second quarterly meeting.
4. No officer is to hold the same office for more than three (3) consecutive years.
5. Officers for YPSBU will be as follows:
 - President - conducts quarterly meetings and appoints committee.
 - Vice-President - assist President; hold the position of President in the absence of the President.
 - Secretary and Treasurer - record minutes of meetings; control bank account; handle any correspondence.
 - Assistant Secretary and Treasurer - assist Secretary and Treasurer; hold office in their absence.
 - Song Leader - lead congregational singing at YPSBU quarterly meetings.
 - Assistant Song Leader - assist Song Leader; hold office of Song Leader in their absence.
6. Each quarterly YPSBU meeting will have a program for Young People especially designed by a program committee.
7. There will be a program committee of three members (or one church) appointed by the President at each quarterly meeting. They will be responsible for the following quarterly program.
8. Young People from the ages 10-45 will be eligible to vote in business if they attend one of the Central Indiana Association Churches.
9. The by-laws can be amended by two-thirds majority vote at the YPSBU quarterly meeting.

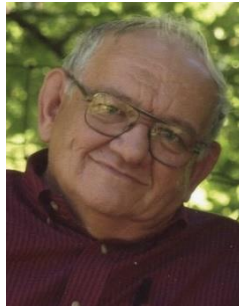
