



SUMMARY OF SYMBOL



OCTOBER 8, 2016 FRIDAY MORNING 10:00 A.M.

The 104th annual session of the General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ convened with the Christian Unity Association at the Pleasant View Separate Baptist Church in Warrensville, NC. The session was opened with Moderator Rev. Jimmy Polston asking Rev. Rex Hall of Christian Unity for the invocation reading. He read from John 11:21-44. The Moderator next called for prayer asking Rev. David Irwin of South KY to lead us. Bro. Stacy Wiggington of Central Indiana led the congregation in singing "Everybody Will Be Happy Over There" as Sis. Shannon Kennedy of Nolynn played the piano and Rev. Danny Bailey of South KY played the guitar.

The Moderator called the Body to order.

Rev. Jimmy Polston led the congregation in pledges to the American Flag, Christian Flag, and Bible, respectively.

We observed a moment of silence for our service personnel followed by a prayer led by Rev. Donnie Wiggington of Central Indiana.

Rev. Polston had Rev. Benny Walden of Central Indiana pray the blessing over this setting of the association.

The Clerk read the letter from the **CENTRAL INDIANA** Association.

A motion to accept the letter, seat the delegates that are present and those that may come in later, and print the letter from Central Indiana Association was made and passed.

The remaining letters were read from the following district associations with motions made and passed to receive the letters, seat the delegates that are present and those that may come in later, and print the letters in the minutes:

Motion was made by Rev. Danny Bailey for the Moderator to appoint an Assistant Moderator for this session due to the absence of Rev. Eddie Freeman. Motion passed. Rev. Johnny Davis of South KY was appointed to serve as the Assistant Moderator. Unanimous consent was given by the Body to appoint Rev. Danny Bailey as the Parliamentarian for the setting of this association.

Bro. Roger Sink of Central Indiana came forward and read the letters from the Bethlehem Association of United Baptist Churches of Jesus Christ and Ancient Christian Association of United Baptist Churches. Motion was made and passed to accept the letters and anymore that may be received and print them in the minutes.

The Clerk read the Articles of Doctrine.

A call for new association(s) was made. None responded.

The Moderator had the visitors to stand to be recognized.

Rev. Josh Polston of South KY asked the blessing on the congregational offering for Association expenses. Bro. Stacy Wiggington led the congregation in singing "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder", accompanied by Sis. Shannon Kennedy on piano and Rev. Danny Bailey on guitar, as an offering totaling \$440 was received.

Our Moderator introduced Rev. Johnny Davis of South KY as the minister to deliver the Introductory Sermon. Rev. Johnny read from II Tim. 3:10-17 and I Peter 1:17-25, 2:1-9. He preached a theme on how it is contained within the scriptures. The scriptures contain instructions on how to live one's life, have a soul saved, and even raise children. All scripture was written by the inspiration of God. Rev. Johnny said that we don't need to only contain the scriptures, but we need to open them up and read them. We need to search the scripture ourselves and not easily stray off the path taking someone else's word for it. The substance of the scriptures will make us grow.

The congregation sang "Living by Faith", "He Lives", and "I've Got That Old Time Religion in My Heart" as the Saints fellowshipped around the altar shaking hands. Bro. Stacy Wiggington of Central Indiana led us in singing

as Sis. Shannon Kennedy of Nolynn played the piano, and Rev. Danny Bailey of South KY played guitar.

The full report of the Divine Service Committee was read and accepted.

The Friday afternoon service was opened with Rev. Mark Polston of the South KY Association leading the congregation in singing, "Are You Washed in the Blood?" as Sis. Lisa Polston of South KY played the piano, Rev. Danny Bailey played the guitar, and Sis. Kelly Craven of Central Indiana played the flute.

Bro. John Hall of the Christian Unity Association had charge of the afternoon devotional service. He read Hosea 14:9. After prayer requests were made, the saints joined in prayer with Bro. Benny Walden of Central Indiana leading. Rev. Jimmy Polston followed it by leading the congregation in a verse of "Old Time Power".

The Assistant Clerk read the minutes of the morning session. A motion was made and properly supported to accept the minutes with any necessary corrections and additions and print them in book form. The motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The Divine Committee made a revision to the report by having Rev. Matt Satter replace Rev. John Perkins for the Saturday Afternoon Devotion. Bro. Allen Wiggington made a motion to accept the revision which was properly supported. Motion passed.

We would recommend that Isaiah 53:1-10 be removed from the list of references for Article 10.

We would recommend that the references for all of our Articles of Doctrine be reviewed by the Constitution Committee annually.

The Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. Treasurer's Report for Home & Foreign missions was given by Bro. Jimmie McGaha, SBMI Treasurer. Bro. Jimmie McGaha made a motion to accept the reports, refer them to the Audit Committee, and print them in the minutes. Motion carried.

CHRISTIANITY: ARE WE CONFORMING OR TRANSFORMING? ISSUES TO CONSIDER: WORSHIP STYLE, MUSIC & PROGRAMS

Bro. David Barr of Christian Unity came forward to share his thoughts and ideas. He read Romans 12:1-2. Conforming: To fasten or shape one thing to another. Transforming: A renewing of the mind. We should not conform to the world, but we should transform into a born-again Christian. We should start out our day by committing to serving the Lord. Bro. David read I Peter 2:9. He shared his thoughts on music concerning southern gospel and Christian rock. Bro. David spoke on how people should dress which is to be modest. Dressing modest applies to men and women. Bro. David opened the floor for discussion on the topic which sparked an interesting conversation with the Body mainly concerning old-time hymns vs. contemporary music.

Rev. Donnie Wiggington of Central Indiana asked the blessing on the offering as the congregation sang "Glory to His Name" as \$149.00 was collected. Rev. Mark Polston of South KY led the singing with Sis. Lisa Polston of South KY accompanying him on piano, Rev. Danny Bailey on guitar, and Sis. Kelly Craven on flute.

Rev. Mark Loggins of Christian Unity delivered the afternoon sermon, reading Phi. 3:10-15. He asked us if we truly know the true Lord Jesus Christ. Just because someone has good morals does not entitle them a place in God's kingdom with eternal life. You must come to God with a humble heart and a willingness to accept Him as your Savior Jesus Christ. He preached how the old paths have been tested and proved. Jesus is the power. If you want the power of God, you cannot be ashamed of Him. Rev. Mark preached about how Jesus went to the cross and died for us so that we may attain the gift of life. Aren't you glad that you have a Savior today that is not broken and is alive? Wouldn't you like to like Him a little better yourself?

Rev. Mark Polston came forward to lead the congregation in singing several songs while Sis. Lisa Polston played the piano, Rev. Danny Bailey played the guitar, and Sis. Kelly Craven played the flute as several from the congregation came forward to pray at the altar. The Body then had a Christian handshake.

Rev. Mark Polston of the South KY Association brought the evening devotional by reading Eph. 5:14-27 and referencing Colossians 3:16. We had

prayer, led by Rev. John Perkins of Central Indiana, after hearing several prayer requests.

The minutes of the Friday afternoon session were read and accepted with the necessary additions or corrections.

Rev. David Irwin of the South KY Association came forward to deliver the doctrinal sermon. He read from II Timothy 1:1-14. Rev. David posed the question, "What is the form of sound words?" (1) It must be scriptural. (2) It must exalt God. (3) Sound words should create Godly tendencies to right. (4) It should embrace God's Word or being. (5) It has to look at man right. (6) We have to look at salvation the right way. Preachers should not be scared to preach about grace. Through grace are we saved. We need to make sure that we hold fast to sound words. Error in doctrine leads to error in practice. He preached that we need to be a doer of the Word. We need to preach it, teach it, and sing it. For the church's sake, we need to get our anchors in place. We need to own our doctrine and live by it. Rev. David preached that faith and love are the two great hold fasts. It has always been about faith and love, and that is what it will always be.

Our Moderator turned the service over to the Christian Unity Association for the communion and foot washing service. Bro. John Hall dismissed the Body for a few minutes in preparation for communion and footwashing. Service reconvened with a verse of "Old Time Power". Rev. After the Resolutions Committee report was accepted, the Moderator requested the Body to graciously stand and give the Christian Unity Association a standing vote of thanks for their outstanding work this year preparing for this year's associational meeting.

After the Auditing Committee report was read, Bro. Allen Wiggington of Central Indiana made a motion that was properly supported to give the Treasurers a standing vote of thanks.

Bro. Michael Jordan of the Nolynn Association and Chairman of the Outreach Committee came forward and read the Outreach Committee's report. A motion was made and properly supported to accept the report and print it in the minutes. Bro. Michael Jordan and Rev. Danny Bailey spoke on the motion. Motion passed.

The Clerk announced the Mission Board members selected by the District Associations.

Rev. Terry Thrasher of the South KY Association came forward for the memorial prayer. He read Thess. 4:13-18 and then led the congregation in the memorial prayer.

Rev. Danny Bailey, SBMI Chairman, came forward and informed the Body that we have the largest number of Separate Baptists in the mission field **ever** for Separate Baptists. Rev. Danny told us that 9 missionaries went to Ivory

Coast this past summer in which 3 of them were young ladies. They conducted a successful Bible school. He bragged on how Sis. Kathy Ridge must be the only white lady to be able to get a chief to color. He then joked about how Rev. Jerry Ridge was the volleyball instructor. Simple things such as coloring and volleyball were ways to communicate and open doors.

Rev. Danny informed the Body concerning the works happening in Haiti. A group of 15 missionaries want to go back to Haiti to conduct Bible school as well. Being a part of the mission work requires hard work and best behavior. SBMI is looking for missionaries, but only if the Lord is directing people to do God's work. There is still a great need for eyeglasses in Haiti.

SBMI bought two lots in Ivory Coast for \$3,500. About \$17K has been raised for the new mission house, but needing around \$40K. It will have modern amenities that will make mission work a little more comfortable for the missionaries. Rev. Danny said that we still need to raise money for motor bikes and another truck because these vehicles wear out quicker there than here due to the lack of great road infrastructure.

Rev. Danny mentioned that two churches closed in the Central Indiana Association. He mentioned that we lost one church in the South KY Association and that one church in Glasgow is close to closing. Rev. Silas Thrasher has taken on the responsibility to work with Glasgow to help prevent it from closing. Rev. Danny talked about the loss of the Mt. Olive Association. He shared how Bro. Olyn Sprowles of Nolynn has taken financial risks to fund SBMI and to be blessed in more ways than one by the Lord.

Rev. Bailey introduced the Mission Board's choice to deliver the Mission sermon, Rev. John Perkins of the Central Indiana Association. He talked about the love that the people of Ivory Coast have for one another. Rev. John then read Acts 17:30. His text was based on "all men everywhere to repent". All men everywhere need to hear the gospel.

He preached how we have always gone to Ivory Coast and preached the gospel. Rev. Jerry Ridge had an idea a couple years ago about taking young people to conduct a Bible school. After many prayers, that idea came to fruition this past summer, and it was successful in reaching out to people. To reach out to all men, it's going to take more than just preachers to spread the Word. "All men everywhere" is bigger than our local communities. It takes all of us to support mission work in Ivory Coast and Haiti.

Rev. John preached how it is our responsibility to take the Word of God to them. We cannot always count on the lost coming to us. Sometimes it means pitching a tent in someone's backyard; sometimes it means traveling across the ocean to spread God's Word. We all need to listen and obey God's calling when He calls. Rev. John said to read Ezekiel 3 if we need to understand how to have a burden for the lost.

The Moderator asked the blessing on the SBMI offering. Rev. Rick Owensby of Central Indiana led the congregation in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms", "Won't It Be Wonderful There?", "I'm Going That Way" with Sis. Lisa Polston of South KY playing the piano, Sis. Kelly Craven of Central Indiana playing the flute, and Rev. Danny Bailey of South KY playing the guitar while the Mission offering was collected for a total of \$1,202 during a Christian handshake.

Rev. Jimmy Polston, without objection from the Body, mentioned to the Body not to consider him for Moderator for 2017. He served as Moderator for 13 years and as Assistant Moderator for 13 years, and he feels that it is time to step down.

Rev. Ed Tharpe mentioned the flyers for the 2017 Mission's Retreat. Bro. Wayne Elliott of Christian Unity prayed the blessing on the noon meal which also served as the dismissal.

He said that there are 98 translations of KJV Bible today. He said that there were around 1,500 words and also complete verses missing from the NIV "Bible". Seven people took seven years translating manuscripts into the KJV Bible. NIV is missing Calvary, being born again, and remission of sin just to name a few. All the translations try to compare and prove against KJV and not against one another. Rev. Jim informed us that the man that owns and prints the NIV is homosexual. The KJV Bible is THE Bible. In 1872 Bethlehem Association of United Baptist was organized by the Zion Association of United Baptist.

BY-LAWS OF SEPARATE BAPTIST MISSIONS, INC. UNDER THE GENERAL ASSOCIATION OF SEPARATE BAPTISTS

Separate Baptist Missions, Inc.

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall be a religious non-profit incorporation for the establishment, furtherance and overseeing of Separate Baptist home and foreign missionary enterprises. The Incorporation shall be established in accordance with the laws of the state of Kentucky and shall be registered to conduct its lawful affairs and privileges in each state, either represented by an established Separate Baptist Church or represented for the establishment of a new Separate Baptist Church in fellowship with the General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ (hereafter referred to as the General Association).

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall consist of a board of three members who are elected for three-year terms by the General Association and of associational directors who will be elected or appointed to yearly terms by the District Associations. It shall be the duty of this board, in-as-much as possible, to carry out the desires of the General Association in all mission matters.

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall be governed with the bylaws established and approved by the General Association. The by-laws may be altered or amended at any General Association by a two-thirds majority vote of the voting delegates. No by-law, established or amended, shall knowingly violate the law(s) of the states under which this incorporation is registered.

Should this incorporation ever be dissolved, all records, monies and properties held by the incorporation at the time of dissolvement shall be turned over to the General Association for disbursement as the General Association may deem necessary and proper.

BY-LAWS OF

SEPARATE BAPTIST MISSIONS INCORPORATED

Section One

The Board

- 1. Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall have a board consisting of a chairman, a secretary, a treasurer, and associational directors. Each board member shall assume his responsibilities upon his election or appointment to office and shall serve in said office until his successor is elected or appointed. The board members shall obtain office and serve terms of duration as follows.
 - A. The chairman of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration.
 - B. The treasurer of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration with his term expiring the year prior to the expiration of the chairman's term.
 - C. The secretary of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration with his term expiring the year prior to the expiration of the treasurer's term.
 - D. The associational directors of this board shall be elected by the District associations for a term of one year duration. They shall be elected yearly. There shall be one Associational director elected from each District association.
- All members of the board and personnel serving under the board must be Separate Baptist personnel.
- 3. A board member may be re-elected or re-appointed to successive terms.
- 4. The board of Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall meet at least once during every associational year other than at the General Association. They may also meet on assent of the board members when and as necessary. Written notices stating the time, date, location and purpose of each special board meeting shall be sent in advance to each board member.
- 5. A Quorum of five board members shall be required to transact official board business.
- 6. All board members shall serve without pay or reimbursement from mission funds *

(With the exception of the treasurer and the secretary who may be reimbursed from the Home Missions fund as deemed proper by the board).

* Changed October 12, 1991 at the General Association.

Section Two Funds and Property

- 1. All funds are to be received on a voluntary manner and no church or District association shall ever be assessed for mission funds.
- The treasurer of the board shall keep a permanent record of all receipts and expenditures and shall present a written yearly financial report to the general Association.

- A. The treasurer's books are to be audited yearly at the General Association by the Auditing Committee.
- B. The treasurer shall be bonded and said bond shall be paid for as general operating expenses.
- Separate accounts and records shall be kept for home and foreign missions funds.
 - A. All undesignated funds received by the treasurer shall be subject to the discretion of the mission board, for either home or foreign mission purposes.
 - B. All funds received designated for a particular purpose shall be used entirely for such designated purpose. If such funds cannot be used for its designated purpose, they shall be returned to their donor and an explanation given as to why they could not be used.
 - A tax-exempt receipt shall be given upon request for all gifts and donations.
- 4. All general operating expenses of the board shall be paid for from the home mission fund.
- 5. The board shall have the authority to withdraw and use funds from their respective accounts for either home or foreign missionary projects.
 - A. Grants or loans cannot be made to any individual for personal use.
 - B. Grants or loans may be made for worthwhile purposes to District associations or churches which may request such aid.
 - C.* Grant amounts shall not exceed five thousand \$5,000.00 given to any one church within one associational year.
 - D.* Loans may not exceed in the amount of ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars and are to be repaid within a period designated at the time of said loan. No interest shall be charged for money loaned.
 - E. A minimum of \$5,000.00 emergency fund will be maintained in the Foreign Mission Treasury.
- 6. All property purchased through the mission board for the establishment of a Separate Baptist Church shall be deeded to the trustees and their successors of the District association in which the church is established. (In event that the District association does not have trustees to which the property may be deeded, it shall remain deeded to Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated)
- All property purchased on the foreign field in behalf of Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall remain, where possible, the property of Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated.
 - * Changed October 12, 2012 at the General Association.

Section Three Missionary Personnel

- All missionaries serving under this board shall preach and teach according to the doctrinal statement of the General Association of Separate Baptist Churches.
- All missionary candidates shall be examined by the board in regards to doctrinal, spiritual and mental requirements and shall furnish a doctor's statement on their physical condition.
- 3. All missionary candidates must do their deputation work with the mission board only assisting.

- 4. All missionaries shall serve pre-designated terms on the mission field and must spend a proportionate amount of time while on furlough in the states reporting to the churches which contributed to their support.
- All missionaries must send regular monthly reports to the board concerning their work and progress while on the field.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1: This body shall be called "The General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ" and shall be composed of ministers, deacons and delegates of the various District Associations and their several churches.

ARTICLE 2: Officers of this body shall be: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary who shall be elected by this body and shall hold office one year or until their successors are elected, and shall serve free, except the Clerk, who shall be paid \$200.00 for his services by the Association.

ARTICLE 3: Duty of the moderator shall be: Preside at all meetings, appoint all committees and cast the deciding vote in the case of a tie. Duties of the Assistant Moderator shall be the same as the Moderator in case of his absence. The Clerk shall make complete Minutes of the proceedings of the Association, inserting in the Minutes the name and addresses of the ministers and church Clerks. The Clerk shall make completed minute books available to the churches no later than March 1 of each associational year if at all possible. The Assistant Clerk shall do the duties of the Clerk in his absence and assist the Clerk at any time he may need him. The Treasurer shall receive and pay out money and make a report at each meeting. The Corresponding Secretary shall correspond with other associations, groups or individuals as directed by this body. No person shall hold more than one elected office in this organization. It shall be the duty of each District Association to contribute \$25.00 or more to the support of this body.

ARTICLE 4: The object of this body shall be to bring about a closer union and give united effort in putting forth the Word of Life.

ARTICLE 5: This Association thus formed shall be a council of advice and shall not exercise any undue authority over God's heritage. Each Association composing this body shall be entitled to three delegates from each church.

ARTICLE 6: This Association shall be governed by parliamentary rules.

ARTICLE 7: Any person wishing to address the body shall rise and address the Moderator.

ARTICLE 8: This body shall have a Mission Board which shall be authorized to oversee the Home and Foreign Mission aspects of our General Association. The said Mission Board shall be governed by the Rules and Regulations set forth

by the General Association. Such Rules and Regulations shall become a part of our General Association Constitution.

ARTICLE 9: Any Association belonging to this Association failing to report at each annual meeting, the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate why they did not report.

ARTICLE 10: Any Association applying for membership in this body shall be required to give evidence of its orthodoxy and shall agree to comply with the rules before being received into this body.

ARTICLE 11: This Constitution, By-Laws or Articles of Doctrine, may be changed or amended by a two-thirds vote* of the body at any regular session, after having been tabled for a period of one associational year. Any changes that are to be made in the Constitution will be presented to the Constitution Committee prior to its submission to this body. The Constitution Committee shall consist of one member from each district association. The Moderator shall appoint a member to the Constitution Committee from each district association. Should the committee be required to convene to act upon any proposal and the appointed member be absent, the General Association's Moderator shall name a replacement.

*Pursuant to action taken at the 1991 General Association "two-thirds vote" was defined as: "two-thirds of those who vote on that particular motion.

ARTICLE 12: The Pledges to American and Christian Flags and the Bible to be conducted by the Moderator at each morning session, prior to invocation and/or devotion.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The Association or Church entertaining the General Association shall be given the privilege of setting the beginning time of each session to be held in that Association or Church and the entertaining Association or Church shall advise the Program Committee for the session about the starting time before the Program Committee reports to the body.
- 2. There shall not be anyone placed on a program or a committee that is not present at that session of the General Association.
- 3. Each District Association shall be responsible to list the names of all delegates and alternates from each church appointed to represent them at the General Association in or with their respective letter to the General Association. The delegates and alternates listed on or with the letter for the District Associations will be the only recognized appointed delegates to the General Association.

ARTICLES OF DOCTRINE

- **ARTICLE 1:** We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice, using the King James version of the Holy Bible for English-speaking people (*see below). Romans 15:4, 1 Corinthians 10:11, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, Genesis 1:1 through Revelation 22:21.
- **ARTICLE 2:** We believe that there is in the God Head three Divine Personages: The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19, 1 Corinthians 12:3, 1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 1, 1 John 5:7.
- **ARTICLE 3:** We believe that man is in a fallen state before God and is unable to liberate himself by any ability he may possess by nature. Isaiah 63:1-5, John 6:44 & 14:6, Romans 8:1-20, 1 Corinthians 15:22.
- **ARTICLE 4:** We believe that salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are through faith in the life, death and resurrection, ascension and intercession of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. John 17:13-17, Hebrews 4:1-3, Ephesians 4:1-8, Titus 3:3-7. Revelation 1:18.
- **ARTICLE 5:** We believe that he who endures to the end, the same shall be saved. Matthew 10:22, 24:13, Hebrews 3:12, 10:38-39, Revelation 2:10.
- **ARTICLE 6:** We believe in the resurrection of the body, the just and the unjust, but every man in his own order, those who have done good, to eternal life, those who have done evil, to eternal damnation and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. Daniel 12:2, Matthew 25:31-46, Acts 17:31.
- **ARTICLE 7:** We believe that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked are eternal. Daniel 12:2, Matthew 25:46, Romans 5:21.
- **ARTICLE 8:** We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordained of Christ appointed in the Church and none but true believers are proper subjects, and that immersion is the Gospel mode of baptism. Matthew 28:19-20, Luke 22:17-20, John 13:14, Acts 2:41, Romans 6:4, Colossians 2:12.
- **ARTICLE 9:** We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week, or Lord's Day, and it should be spent in public or private worship, and we abstain from worldly concerns, except in case of necessity or mercy. Luke 23:56, John 20:26, Acts 20:7, 1 Corinthians 16:2, Revelation 1:10.
- **ARTICLE 10:** We believe it is our duty to be tender, affectionate to one another, in honor preferring one another, to study the happiness of God's people in general and do all we can to support, promote and spread the Gospel. Romans 12:10, Galatians 6:1-2, 10, 2 Corinthians 9:14.
- **ARTICLE 11:** We believe that Jesus Christ, by the Grace of God tasted death for everyman, that none can partake of His Holy Divine benefits except by repentance toward God and Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; Infants and the innocent, due to lack of mental ability excepted, they being included in the covenant of God's Grace. Matthew 9:13, Luke 18:15-18, John 3:15-17, Acts 4:12, Romans 5:15, 1 Timothy 2:5-6.
- **ARTICLE 12:** We believe that, at Christ's coming in the clouds of Heaven, all Christians will be gathered with Him in the clouds and that time shall be no more, thus leaving no time for a literal one thousand year reign. Matthew 24:29-31. Revelation 10:6, 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18, 2 Peter 3:10.
- *We believe that non-English speaking people should use a Bible comparable to the King James Version of the Holy Bible.
