



OCTOBER 12, 2018 FRIDAY MORNING 10:00 A.M.

The 106th annual session of the General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ convened with the Nolynn Association at the Nolynn Association Separate Baptist Campground in Magnolia, KY. The session was opened with Moderator Rev. Mark Polston asking Rev. Neal Price of Nolynn for the invocation prayer. Bro. Rick Goff of Nolynn led the congregation in singing "Just a Little Talk with Jesus" as Sis. Phyllis Wiggington of Central Indiana played the piano.

The Moderator called the Body to order.

Rev. Mark Polston led the congregation in pledges to the American Flag, Christian Flag, and Bible, respectively.

We observed a moment of silence for our service personnel followed by a prayer led by the Moderator.

Rev. Eudell Stilts of Nolynn welcomed everyone to the 106th annual session of the General Association.

The Moderator made an appointment if no objection to have Bro. Randy Kennedy to fill the position of Assistant Clerk for today in the absence of Rev. Donnie Wiggington. There was no objection.

Rev. Polston had Rev. Jimmy Polston of Central Indiana pray the blessing over this setting of the association.

The Clerk read the letter from the **CENTRAL INDIANA** Association.

A motion to accept the letter, seat the delegates that are present and those that may come in later, and print the letter from Central Indiana Association was made and passed.

The remaining letters were read from the following district associations with motions made and passed to receive the letters, seat the delegates that are present and those that may come in later, and print the letters in the minutes: **CHRISTIAN UNITY, NOLYNN, SOUTH KENTUCKY, and WEST VIRGINIA**.

Bro. Roger Sink of Central Indiana came forward and read the letters from the Ancient Christian Association, Wills Creek Association, Union Association of United Baptists, and Bethlehem Association of United Baptists. Motion was made and passed to accept the letters and anymore that may be received and print them in the minutes.

The Clerk then read the Articles of Doctrine.

A call for new association(s) was made. None responded. The Moderator had the visitors to stand to be recognized.

Rev. Ed Tharpe of Central Indiana asked the blessing on the congregational offering for Association expenses. Bro. Rick Goff of Nolynn led the congregation in singing "Victory In Jesus", accompanied by Sis. Phyllis Wiggington of Central Indiana on piano, as an offering totaling \$565 was received.

Our Moderator introduced Rev. Josh Polston of South KY as the minister to deliver the Introductory Sermon. Rev. Josh read Galatians 5. After having prayer over the scripture, Rev. Josh took his text from Galatians 5:24. We must remember the sacrifice that was made for our liberty. We must choose to serve God and not the carnal flesh of the world. If you find yourself walking in the Spirit, it makes it easier to make the right decisions and be obedient unto God. "Be ready to go when God says go and stand when God says stand." If we are saved, we should have a desire to do the Lord's work. We are to be motivated by the Spirit to have the zeal that we need to stand and work for God. Being obedient shows our thankfulness to God. He posed the question to the congregation, "Does your relationship with God mean something to you?" As referenced in Luke 9:23, we need to take up our cross and follow Him. Rev. Josh referred to Hebrews 5:8-9. Turn to God so that you can reap the benefits of eternal salvation.

The congregation sang "I'll Meet You in the Morning", "I'd Rather be an Old-Time Christian", "Jesus, Hold My Hand", and "If We Never Meet Again" as the Saints fellowshipped around the altar shaking hands. Bro. Rick Goff of Nolynn led us in singing as Sis. Phyllis Wiggington of Central Indiana played the piano. Several testimonies and praises followed.

Rev. Neal Price of the Nolynn Association had charge of the afternoon devotional service. He read Luke 21:1-4. The saints met at the altar with prayer requests as prayer was led by Bro. Olyn Sprowles of Nolynn.

The General Association Treasurer's report was given by the Clerk. A motion was made to accept the report, refer it to the Audit Committee, and print it in the minutes. Motion carried.

The Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. Treasurer's Reports for Foreign & Home Missions was given by Rev. Danny Bailey, SBMI Chairman. Motions were made to accept the reports, refer them to the Audit Committee, and print them in the minutes. Motions carried.

"What does it take to have a spiritual Church?" Us as Christians need to walk in the Spirit and witness to our lost.

Bro. Barry Stevens of South KY came forward to share his thoughts. He read Isaiah 58, 1 Corr. 2:12-13, 1 Corr. 3:17, Phi. 3:11-16. We need to be obedient to God, allow the Spirit to flow through our lives, and be more spiritual for the Lord.

Next was Rev. Matt Satter of Central Indiana. He said that it first takes love for your brethren. If we walk in the flesh, we are going to walk "fleshly", but if we walk in the spirit then we are going to walk Godly. He mentioned how Rev. Ed Tharpe was a great shepherd for him and his church because they were fed well with love and knowledge. Rev. Matt stated that it starts with the leadership. He said that we also need to spend in other areas than just the brick-and-mortar church such as playgrounds for children or whatever it may be that helps your church's ministry. We must be spiritual, preach the Word, and take every opportunity possible to show love to others. We need to make sure that the Lord's will be done here on earth as it is in Heaven.

Rev. Neal Price of Nolynn came forward to conclude the discussions. He read Psalms 73:23-25, Phi. 4:17, and Matt. 16:17-18. Rev. Neal said that we need to do much praying and fasting. We all need to move up closer to God. ALL OF US. The church is not just Separate Baptist. It is all denominations, and we all need to work together to help get lives saved. The world has changed, but the Word of God has not. We need to praise the Lord more for all the things that He has blessed us with in our lives.

An informative Q&A session followed.

Rev. Rick Owensby of Central Indiana asked the blessing on the offering as the congregation sang "Joy Unspeakable" as \$276.00 was collected. Bro. Dan Swanson of Central Indiana led the singing with Sis. Phyllis Wiggington of Central Indiana accompanying her on piano and Sis. Kelly Craven of Central Indiana on flute.

Rev. Jeff Blevins of Christian Unity came forward to deliver an energized, fiery afternoon sermon. He shared his testimony when he was first saved that he was on fire for God. He was growing leaps and bounds, but then the adversary came along when he tried to use the altar to pray. The devil was trying to make him question his use of the altar when he wanted to use it. It takes us getting back to God and the "old paths" which is the Word of God. Although he heard the adversary

speaking to him, he didn't listen to it. He's still preaching today because he listened to God. Disobedience to God is sin, and it hardens the heart. Don't let the devil defeat you because God is your strength. We live in some dark times, but God is going to shine His brightest when it is dark. The darkness cannot comprehend the light of God. Rev. Jeff asked the congregation, "How big is God in your life?" God is big, and He is a great God! There is liberty when God's spirit is involved. He read Hebrews 10:37, Luke 10:2, and John 4:34-35. We come to worship Him in the house of God, but we go out into the world to serve Him. He shared another testimony how important it is for us to "walk the walk" in front of lost people and children. They see and learn from our example. He finished by reading Hebrews 3:13.

Bro. Dan Swanson came forward to lead the congregation in singing "I've Never Been Sorry", "Praise Him Praise Him" while Sis. Phyllis Wiggington played the piano and Sis. Kelly Craven played flute. The Body had a Christian handshake.

Rev. Troy Arnett of Nolynn dismissed us, and Rev. Mike Gribbins of Nolynn prayed the blessing on the supper meal.

Our Assistant Moderator, Rev. Johnny Davis of South KY, had charge of the evening service. He asked all to stand and asked Rev. Ed Tharpe to lead in a word of prayer. Special singing was as follows:

Rev. John Perkins of the Central Indiana Association brought the evening devotional by reading Luke 13:24-33A. Bro. Johnny mentioned how he enjoyed today's messages and how we need to hear these great sermons. His devotional reading was of a great sermon Jesus preached but people did not like it much like today. He encouraged us to let the world know our churches are here and available to them. We had prayer, led by Bro. Dan Sink of the Central Indiana Association, after hearing several prayer requests.

The minutes of the Friday afternoon session were read and accepted with necessary additions or corrections.

Rev. Terry Thrasher of the South KY Association came forward to deliver the doctrinal sermon. Bro. Terry mentioned the definition of doctrine and mentioned it is instruction or a guide for us. Bro. Terry read Article 1 of our Doctrine stating we believe the Bible. He read Deuteronomy 8:1-3 & Hebrews 6:9-20. Bro. Terry spoke on the "Immutability of God's Council". There is only one true doctrine, which is the Word of God. Giving examples of Bible characters that did well with the free will God gave us and some who did not do well. Every word of God is important for us to hear and obey. Bro. Terry warned us to not be caught up in these other books some call bibles. The Word of God is not difficult to understand with the direction of the Holy Spirit. Beware of the false gods and teachers in the world today. We must be in line with every word of God's Word. God does not want us to be ignorant of what he expects of us, which is why he gave us the Bible to lead and guide us. Study the True Word of God so when a counterfeit comes along you will know it isn't true. We all must continue to grow in the Lord keeping ourselves unspotted from the world. Christ is coming to get his Bride and that Bride must be without spot or blemish. If we believe the Word of God and do as instructed by it we can enter into rest with our Lord one day. The **CONSTITUTION Committee** report was read. Motion made and supported to accept the report and print it in the minutes.

The Clerk announced the Mission Board members selected by the District Associations.

Rev. Lonzo Wiggington of the Central Indiana Association came forward with comments and the memorial prayer.

Rev. Danny Bailey, SBMI Chairman, came forward and informed the Body that SBMI budget has nearly reach \$200,000! Rev. Bailey reminded everyone that SBMI has a website Separatebaptistmissions.org. He reminded us of the ways and means report that states that every church in the general association should appoint a mission representative and to keep in contact with them. He said to contact Bro. Randy Kennedy (administrator) to make any updates necessary to the web site. Bro. Danny spoke about the new house, that is fully furnished and how thankful we are to have such a facility in Cote d'Ivoire, Africa. He pointed out the fact that we now have utility bills with the new house. Bro. Danny thanked everyone for the overwhelming support of the mission emphases offerings newly designated this past year. Bro. Danny recognized those in attendance who have travelled to both Africa and Haiti. Bro. Danny announced the notebook project and how they would like all churches to help contribute supplies to the project. He thanked those who already have begun contributing to the work. He asked everyone with any questions concerning the project to contact Sis. Robin Abbott or Sis Morgan Sink. Bro. Danny reminded us of the eyeglass project to collect eye glasses to be distributed to the mission fields, and how it could be a great way to take part in mission work. He announced that the SBMI has purchased a portable water well drilling machine. He said supplies will be needed to execute the drilling of wells in Africa. He announced that Bro. Jerry will be making a few test runs here in the states to learn how to drill wells. He mentioned two churches in central Indiana that need wells. After answering a few

questions, Bro. Danny turned the service over to Bro. Jerry Ridge for a slide presentation.

Bro Jerry opened by stating how humble he is to stand before the Separate Baptist people. He said the work is such a joy, and how it's always changing and new. He mentioned several ways the money given is used in the work. He shared pictures of some of the great people who live and work so diligently there in Africa. He mentioned how prayer is so important in all that takes place. He showed some of the gifts given to the wonderful people there, such as the motorbike given to help spread the gospel. He mentioned how the people who worked on the house wanted us to have the best. Bro. Jerry said it was a house fit for a king. He said we have running water electricity, a washing machine. He said it is worth the travel to get there and work with the people. This year they went to seven villages. They passed out crayons papers and pencils that the people loved. They had a Bible school and taught with skits during the sermons. There was a lot of work to do preparing for each day. They met with chiefs and where granted permission each time to minister. They went to the African General Association where hundreds of people attended. He mentioned a couple there that have a dream of coming and worshiping in America. He said water there is very poor. Wells they have are dug by hand up to 35' deep. They travel with water buckets to transport the water to the villages. They have one well with a hand pump that cares for 3000 people. His prayer is to provide water to each village with this new water drill. He said we could drill for water during the day and preach about "the water of life" at night. Bro Jerry thanked Bro. Benny and Sis. Ruth Ann Walden for travelling to Houston Texas to pick up the new drill rig. He asked for prayer that no tariff or tax be incurred in the transport of this rig. He again praised the churches for the wonderful support of the mission work. He told of the great success of the word going out and souls being saved. He shared a wonderful video of the washing of the brother's feet in Africa. He encouraged anyone who wanted to go to Africa to let him know, so he can prepare for the next trip.

Bro. Jerry introduced Rev. Randy Brown for the mission sermon. Bro. Randy said he is thankful for having the opportunity to work with Bro. Jerry and others in the mission work. Bro. Randy read Matthew 5:13-16. After prayer Bro. Randy began to speak of how salt is to give flavor and gives us a thirst for water. He mentioned how God will give you living water. He said "Ye are the light of the world". He shared how dark it gets at night in Haiti. He wants to be the light for the Lord. He wants to have compassion on those who are in need. He said people may see something different in him and begin to realize conviction and begin to desire that living water. The world needs the Lord. They need to hear the preaching so that they may become convicted and be saved. He

mentioned how the children in Haiti are willing to walk many miles to come to VBS. Let your light shine.

The Moderator asked the Mission board and representatives to come and receive the Mission offering. Bro. Ed Tharpe asked a blessing on the SBMI offering. Rev. Melvin Underwood led the congregation in singing "He Set Me Free", "Heaven's Jubilee", "Everybody Will be Happy Over there" "I never shall forget the day", "Amazing Grace" with Sis. Phyllis Wiggington playing the piano, Sis. Kelly Craven playing the flute, Bro. Arnold Sprowles playing the guitar, while the mission offering was collected for a total of \$2,246.00. The saints fellowshipped and shook hands.

There was much praise, testimonies, singing and rejoicing.
The moderator then asked Bro. Cody Blair from Christian Unity
Association to dismiss from this session and Rev. Rodney Smith from
South Kentucky Association to ask the blessing on the noon meal.

Under section 1, number 1 of the SBMI by-laws, we add assistant treasurer to the list of officers so that section 1, number 1 reads:

Separate Baptist Missions Incorporated shall have a board consisting of a chairman, a secretary, a treasurer, an assistant treasurer, and associational directors. Each board member shall assume his responsibilities upon his election or appointment to office and shall serve in said office until his successor is elected or appointed. BY-LAWS OF SEPARATE BAPTIST MISSIONS, INC. UNDER THE GENERAL ASSOCIATION OF SEPARATE BAPTISTS

Separate Baptist Missions, Inc.

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall be a religious non-profit incorporation for the establishment, furtherance and overseeing of Separate Baptist home and foreign missionary enterprises. The Incorporation shall be established in accordance with the laws of the state of Kentucky and shall be registered to conduct its lawful affairs and privileges in each state, either represented by an established Separate Baptist Church or represented for the establishment of a new Separate Baptist Church in fellowship with the General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ (hereafter referred to as the General Association).

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall consist of a board of three members who are elected for three-year terms by the General Association and of associational directors who will be elected or appointed to yearly terms by the District Associations. It shall be the duty of this board, in-as-much as possible, to carry out the desires of the General Association in all mission matters.

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall be governed with the bylaws established and approved by the General Association. The by-laws may be altered or amended at any General Association by a two-thirds majority vote of the voting delegates. No by-law, established or amended, shall knowingly violate the law(s) of the states under which this incorporation is registered.

Should this incorporation ever be dissolved, all records, monies and properties held by the incorporation at the time of dissolvement shall be turned over to the General Association for disbursement as the General Association may deem necessary and proper.

BY-LAWS OF

SEPARATE BAPTIST MISSIONS INCORPORATED

Section One

The Board

- Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall have a board consisting of a chairman, a secretary, a treasurer, and associational directors. Each board member shall assume his responsibilities upon his election or appointment to office and shall serve in said office until his successor is elected or appointed. The board members shall obtain office and serve terms of duration as follows.
 - A. The chairman of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration.
 - B. The treasurer of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration with his term expiring the year prior to the expiration of the chairman's term.
 - C. The secretary of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration with his term expiring the year prior to the expiration of the treasurer's term.
 - D. The associational directors of this board shall be elected by the District associations for a term of one year duration. They shall be elected yearly. There shall be one Associational director elected from each District association.
- All members of the board and personnel serving under the board must be Separate Baptist personnel.
- 3. A board member may be re-elected or re-appointed to successive terms.
- 4. The board of Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall meet at least once during every associational year other than at the General Association. They may also meet on assent of the board members when and as necessary. Written notices stating the time, date, location and purpose of each special board meeting shall be sent in advance to each board member.
- A Quorum of five board members shall be required to transact official board business
- 6. All board members shall serve without pay or reimbursement from mission funds *

(With the exception of the treasurer and the secretary who may be reimbursed from the Home Missions fund as deemed proper by the board).

* Changed October 12, 1991 at the General Association.

Section Two Funds and Property

- 1. All funds are to be received on a voluntary manner and no church or District association shall ever be assessed for mission funds.
- The treasurer of the board shall keep a permanent record of all receipts and expenditures and shall present a written yearly financial report to the general Association.

- A. The treasurer's books are to be audited yearly at the General Association by the Auditing Committee.
- B. The treasurer shall be bonded and said bond shall be paid for as general operating expenses.
- Separate accounts and records shall be kept for home and foreign missions funds.
 - A. All undesignated funds received by the treasurer shall be subject to the discretion of the mission board, for either home or foreign mission purposes.
 - B. All funds received designated for a particular purpose shall be used entirely for such designated purpose. If such funds cannot be used for its designated purpose, they shall be returned to their donor and an explanation given as to why they could not be used.
 - A tax-exempt receipt shall be given upon request for all gifts and donations.
- All general operating expenses of the board shall be paid for from the home mission fund.
- 5. The board shall have the authority to withdraw and use funds from their respective accounts for either home or foreign missionary projects.
 - A. Grants or loans cannot be made to any individual for personal use.
 - B. Grants or loans may be made for worthwhile purposes to District associations or churches which may request such aid.
 - C.* Grant amounts shall not exceed five thousand \$5,000.00 given to any one church within one associational year.
 - D.* Loans may not exceed in the amount of ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars and are to be repaid within a period designated at the time of said loan. No interest shall be charged for money loaned.
 - E. A minimum of \$5,000.00 emergency fund will be maintained in the Foreign Mission Treasury.
- 6. All property purchased through the mission board for the establishment of a Separate Baptist Church shall be deeded to the trustees and their successors of the District association in which the church is established. (In event that the District association does not have trustees to which the property may be deeded, it shall remain deeded to Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated)
- All property purchased on the foreign field in behalf of Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall remain, where possible, the property of Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated.
 - * Changed October 12, 2012 at the General Association.

Section Three Missionary Personnel

- All missionaries serving under this board shall preach and teach according to the doctrinal statement of the General Association of Separate Baptist Churches.
- All missionary candidates shall be examined by the board in regards to doctrinal, spiritual and mental requirements and shall furnish a doctor's statement on their physical condition.
- 3. All missionary candidates must do their deputation work with the mission board only assisting.

- 4. All missionaries shall serve pre-designated terms on the mission field and must spend a proportionate amount of time while on furlough in the states reporting to the churches which contributed to their support.
- All missionaries must send regular monthly reports to the board concerning their work and progress while on the field.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1: This body shall be called "The General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ" and shall be composed of ministers, deacons and delegates of the various District Associations and their several churches.

ARTICLE 2: Officers of this body shall be: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary who shall be elected by this body and shall hold office one year or until their successors are elected, and shall serve free, except the Clerk, who shall be paid \$200.00 for his services by the Association.

ARTICLE 3: Duty of the moderator shall be: Preside at all meetings, appoint all committees and cast the deciding vote in the case of a tie. Duties of the Assistant Moderator shall be the same as the Moderator in case of his absence. The Clerk shall make complete Minutes of the proceedings of the Association, inserting in the Minutes the name and addresses of the ministers and church Clerks. The Clerk shall make completed minute books available to the churches no later than March 1 of each associational year if at all possible. The Assistant Clerk shall do the duties of the Clerk in his absence and assist the Clerk at any time he may need him. The Treasurer shall receive and pay out money and make a report at each meeting. The Corresponding Secretary shall correspond with other associations, groups or individuals as directed by this body. No person shall hold more than one elected office in this organization. It shall be the duty of each District Association to contribute \$25.00 or more to the support of this body.

ARTICLE 4: The object of this body shall be to bring about a closer union and give united effort in putting forth the Word of Life.

ARTICLE 5: This Association thus formed shall be a council of advice and shall not exercise any undue authority over God's heritage. Each Association composing this body shall be entitled to three delegates from each church.

ARTICLE 6: This Association shall be governed by parliamentary rules.

ARTICLE 7: Any person wishing to address the body shall rise and address the Moderator.

ARTICLE 8: This body shall have a Mission Board which shall be authorized to oversee the Home and Foreign Mission aspects of our General Association. The said Mission Board shall be governed by the Rules and Regulations set forth

by the General Association. Such Rules and Regulations shall become a part of our General Association Constitution.

ARTICLE 9: Any Association belonging to this Association failing to report at each annual meeting, the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate why they did not report.

ARTICLE 10: Any Association applying for membership in this body shall be required to give evidence of its orthodoxy and shall agree to comply with the rules before being received into this body.

ARTICLE 11: This Constitution, By-Laws or Articles of Doctrine, may be changed or amended by a two-thirds vote* of the body at any regular session, after having been tabled for a period of one associational year. Any changes that are to be made in the Constitution will be presented to the Constitution Committee prior to its submission to this body. The Constitution Committee shall consist of one member from each district association. The Moderator shall appoint a member to the Constitution Committee from each district association. Should the committee be required to convene to act upon any proposal and the appointed member be absent, the General Association's Moderator shall name a replacement.

*Pursuant to action taken at the 1991 General Association "two-thirds vote" was defined as: "two-thirds of those who vote on that particular motion.

ARTICLE 12: The Pledges to American and Christian Flags and the Bible to be conducted by the Moderator at each morning session, prior to invocation and/or devotion.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The Association or Church entertaining the General Association shall be given the privilege of setting the beginning time of each session to be held in that Association or Church and the entertaining Association or Church shall advise the Program Committee for the session about the starting time before the Program Committee reports to the body.
- 2. There shall not be anyone placed on a program or a committee that is not present at that session of the General Association.
- 3. Each District Association shall be responsible to list the names of all delegates and alternates from each church appointed to represent them at the General Association in or with their respective letter to the General Association. The delegates and alternates listed on or with the letter for the District Associations will be the only recognized appointed delegates to the General Association.

ARTICLES OF DOCTRINE

- **ARTICLE 1:** We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice, using the King James version of the Holy Bible for English-speaking people (*see below). Romans 15:4, 1 Corinthians 10:11, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, Genesis 1:1 through Revelation 22:21.
- **ARTICLE 2:** We believe that there is in the God Head three Divine Personages: The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19, 1 Corinthians 12:3, 1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 1, 1 John 5:7.
- **ARTICLE 3:** We believe that man is in a fallen state before God and is unable to liberate himself by any ability he may possess by nature. Isaiah 63:1-5, John 6:44 & 14:6, Romans 8:1-20, 1 Corinthians 15:22.
- **ARTICLE 4:** We believe that salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are through faith in the life, death and resurrection, ascension and intercession of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. John 17:13-17, Hebrews 4:1-3, Ephesians 4:1-8, Titus 3:3-7, Revelation 1:18.
- **ARTICLE 5:** We believe that he who endures to the end, the same shall be saved. Matthew 10:22, 24:13, Hebrews 3:12, 10:38-39, Revelation 2:10.
- **ARTICLE 6:** We believe in the resurrection of the body, the just and the unjust, but every man in his own order, those who have done good, to eternal life, those who have done evil, to eternal damnation and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. Daniel 12:2, Matthew 25:31-46, Acts 17:31.
- **ARTICLE 7:** We believe that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked are eternal. Daniel 12:2, Matthew 25:46, Romans 5:21.
- **ARTICLE 8:** We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordained of Christ appointed in the Church and none but true believers are proper subjects, and that immersion is the Gospel mode of baptism. Matthew 28:19-20, Luke 22:17-20, John 13:14, Acts 2:41, Romans 6:4, Colossians 2:12.
- **ARTICLE 9:** We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week, or Lord's Day, and it should be spent in public or private worship, and we abstain from worldly concerns, except in case of necessity or mercy. Luke 23:56, John 20:26, Acts 20:7, 1 Corinthians 16:2. Revelation 1:10.
- **ARTICLE 10:** We believe it is our duty to be tender, affectionate to one another, in honor preferring one another, to study the happiness of God's people in general and do all we can to support, promote and spread the Gospel. Romans 12:10, Galatians 6:1-2, 10, 2 Corinthians 9:14.
- **ARTICLE 11:** We believe that Jesus Christ, by the Grace of God tasted death for every man, that none can partake of His Holy Divine benefits except by repentance toward God and Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; Infants and the innocent, due to lack of mental ability excepted, they being included in the covenant of God's Grace. Matthew 9:13, Luke 18:15-18, John 3:15-17, Acts 4:12, Romans 5:15, 1Timothy 2:5-6.
- **ARTICLE 12:** We believe that, at Christ's coming in the clouds of Heaven, all Christians will be gathered with Him in the clouds and that time shall be no more, thus leaving no time for a literal one thousand year reign. Matthew 24:29-31. Revelation 10:6, 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18, 2 Peter 3:10.
- *We believe that non-English speaking people should use a Bible comparable to the King James Version of the Holy Bible.
