



OCTOBER 11, 2019 FRIDAY MORNING 10:00 A.M.

The 107th annual session of the General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ convened with the Central Indiana Association at the Central Indiana Association of Separate Baptist Campground in Morgantown, IN. The session opened with Moderator Rev. Mark Polston giving a warm welcome and asking everyone to stand while reciting the pledges to the American flag, Christian flag and the Bible. The moderator then asked Rev. Homer Whited of Central Indiana to come forward with the invocation prayer. The congregation sang, "He Keeps me Singing". Bro. Rick Owensby of Central Indiana led the congregation singing, Sis. Mary Ann Sink of Central Indiana played the piano, Rev. Jimmy Polston Central Indiana and Rev. Danny Bailey of South Kentucky played guitars and Sis. Kelly Craven played the flute as Bro. Nick Popplewell ran the sound system for the morning session.

The Moderator welcomed everyone and called the Body to order.

Rev. Polston asked Rev. Ed Tharpe of Central Indiana to pray the blessing over this setting of the association.

The Clerk read the letter from the **CENTRAL INDIANA**Association.

A motion to accept the letter, seat the delegates that are present and those that may come in later, and print the letter and other information from the Central Indiana Association was made and passed.

Bro. Roger Sink, Corresponding Secretary, came forward and read the letters from the Union Association of United Baptist, and Bethlehem Association of United Baptists. Motion was made and passed to accept the letters and anymore that may be received and print them in the minutes.

The Clerk then read the Articles of Doctrine.

A call for new association(s) was made. None responded.
The Moderator had the visitors to stand to be recognized.
Rev. Donnie Wiggington of Central Indiana asked the blessing on the offering for Association expenses. The congregation sang "He Set Me Free", as an offering totaling \$351 was received.

Our Moderator introduced Rev. Danny Bailey of South KY as the minister to deliver the Introductory Sermon. Rev. Danny greeted everyone and encouraged everyone to visit other associations, as he has been able to do. Bro. Danny read John 1:29-34. Bro. Danny spoke of John the Baptist and how he dressed differently and never cut his hair because he was born a Nazarite. Bro. Danny spoke of how we all have the same message we just express it in different ways. After having read the scripture, he announced his text from verse 30 "This is He". The world longed for Jesus. The first prophecy of Christ found in Genesis 3:14,15, "And the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all the cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life: And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel." God would raise up a prophet John the Baptist. Christ's coming was spoken of by the prophets through the years. Brother Danny spoke of the prophecy of a kingdom without end. He mentioned the dream of Nebuchadnezzar interpreted by Daniel. How the image represented the world powers and how the stone cut out of the mountain without hands and smote the image and the mountain became the Kingdom. This is HE, the one that fulfilled the prophecy. God had sent him unto the world. The Jews waited 600 years. John was there to tell them this is HE. It is what they were looking for and what they hoped for. Christ was an ordinary one who lived among us. Rev. Danny quoted the angels announcement of Christs birth. They were looking for their king, their deliverer this is he. John said the one coming after me is preferred before me. Not knowing Him John saw the Holy Ghost descend upon Christ. Bro Danny mentioned how we are under oppression even today. This man came to set us free. He came raising the dead and healing many. John had the privilege of introducing this man to the world. Bro Danny mention how there are so many prophecy have been

written. How he came to die for the sins of the world. Our sins our cleansed, not covered by the blood of Christ. Without the shedding of blood, there is no remission. He came to die for our sins. It is our responsibility to introduce Jesus Christ to the world. The Lamb of God who takes away sin and is coming back to take his children home. This same Jesus shall return in like manner, as you see him go, the angel told them as they stood gazing. He is the only one that can take our sin away. We need to point people toward Him. "This is He"!

The congregation sang "Only Trust Him", "Standing on the Promises", There is Power in the Blood", What a Friend we have in Jesus" and "At Calvary" as the saints fellowshipped around the altar shaking hands. Several testimonies and praises followed.

The Friday afternoon service opened by the congregation singing "The Eastern Gate". Sis. Kim Wilson of South Kentucky led the singing. Sis. Margaret Wiggington of Central Indiana played the piano. Rev. Danny Bailey and Rev. Jimmy Polston played guitars and Sis. Kelly Craven played the flute. Bro Nick Popplewell ran the sound system.

Rev. Anthony Wiggington of the Central Indiana Association had charge of the afternoon devotional service. He read Daniel 3:23-27. The saints met at the altar with prayer requests. The prayer was led by Jimmie McGaha of Central Indiana.

The Treasurer, Bro. Charles Jordan, gave the General Association Treasurer's report. A motion was made to accept the report, refer it to the Auditing Committee, and print it in the minutes. Motion carried.

Bro. Jimmie McGaha, SBMI Treasurer, gave the Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. Treasurer's Reports for Foreign & Home Missions. Motion was made to accept the reports, refer them to the Auditing Committee, and print them in the minutes. Motions carried.

The Moderator asked Bro. Allen Wiggington to lead the congregation in sing "To God Be the Glory"

The moderator then asked Rev. Nathan Hunter and Rev. Mike Wilson to come forward for the following presentation:

"How is silence the enemy of Truth?" Sometimes we as Christians are too busy, silent or intimidated.

Rev. Nathan of Central Indiana read Ezekiel 33:1-12. As a Christian we a responsible for the great commission of spreading the gospel. If we are silent, the devil wins. We are to be watchmen like Ezekiel. Sometimes we say we are too busy. Bro. Nathan gave the example of his own busy life. However, God still gives us time to serve him. Bro. Nathan mentioned how abortion was allowed because we were too silent. Bro. Nathan read Acts 4:14-21. The Disciples were threatened to never speak the word. Bro. Nathan read Acts 4:29. The disciple's response was prayer for boldness to speak the word. Bro. Nathan encouraged us to be bold, take a stand, speak out and preach the gospel.

Next was Rev. Mike Wilson of South Kentucky. Bro. Mike mentioned Moses when God asked him what was in his hand, a rod. We are responsible for what we have. Tell people about the Lord by whatever means you have. He spoke of how our walk is different. Your life is an example. Bro. Mike gave the example of making a public service announcement. It does not cost much. There are simple things we can do. Christ expects us to do a few things for him.

An informative Q&A session followed with examples of visiting nursing homes, passing out Bible tracks and notifying other churches of events going on.

Rev. Matt Satter of Central Indiana asked the blessing on the offering as he and Rev. Ed Tharpe collected and the congregation sang "Jesus Saves" as \$224.00 was collected.

Rev. Johnny Davis of South Kentucky came forward to deliver the afternoon sermon. He asked the congregation to stand while he read Nehemiah chapter 1. Rev. Johnny read verse 18 in chapter 2 and announced his text, "Let us rise up and build". Rev. Johnny shared how he remembered how great services have been in the past and how he is concerned that they are fewer and farther between. Nehemiah was concerned; there are things we need to be concerned about. Nehemiah sat down, prayed, and fasted. He had a burden he prayed and wept. He went back to the king and the king noticed his countenance was changed. We need to cry out to God, have a burden for people. Bro. Johnny mentioned how the walls slowly get broken down. We need to examine ourselves. We have something to fight for. Nehemiah wanted to be that servant. We need to ask for more boldness like Nehemiah. Use what you have and if you think you need more ask God! He is able to give us what we need. If you're going to please the Lord, you are going to sacrifice something. Bro. Johnny read chapter 2 verse 11-18. Nehemiah gave God the credit for being good to him. Let US rise up and build. It's not a one man show. We need to be strong and go back to prayer! Don't let the devil take you down to the valley of oh no! Start building the wall for The Lamb of God! Those that sin have no part in the kingdom of heaven. The Lord is still on the throne! Let us stand in the old paths and preach the gospel with power. The people had a mind to work. We had better be about the work also.

The congregation sang "Do You Know My Jesus", "What a Day That Will Be", "I'm Living in Canaan Now" while the Body had a Christian handshake.

After many testimonies, Bro. Jimmy Wheeler of Central Indiana dismissed us, and Bro. Stacy Wiggington of Central Indiana prayed the blessing on the supper meal.

The Clerk then read reports of the following committees, **RESOLUTIONS, AUDITING, ARRANGEMENTS, TEMPERANCE, WAYS AND MEANS, PROGRAM, OUTREACH,** motion made to accept the reports and print them in the minutes after each reading.

The Clerk announced the Mission Board members selected by the District Associations.

Rev. Eudel Stilts of the Nolynn Association came forward with comments and the memorial prayer.

Rev. Danny Bailey, SBMI Chairman, came forward and reminded us that we can come to the committee to ask about what is going on. SBMI has purchased a well drill. The drill has been shipped and is on its way to the Ivory Coast. Bro. Jerry Ridge and Bro. Terry Thrasher were planning to go drill wells in October; however the rig has not made it over there yet. They are waiting to make arrangements to go once the drill has been delivered. SBMI estimated \$3500 to \$4000 to drill each well. The cost is to buy well casing, generator, pipe, wiring and other supplies needed to install a well. The churches are looking forward to having clean drinking water. Bro. Danny encouraged us to give to this mission work. Bro. Danny informed us that next year (2020) would be the elections in Cote Ivoire. He asked us to pray for peaceful elections. There is a fund set up to feed the children in Haiti through an organization called "Gods Littlest Angels". Bro Randy Brown is planning to go to Haiti this year to learn more about this organization. Bro. Danny reminded us of the different ways we can help. Any money sent can be designated to a specific cause such as a truck or motorbike or a well. He also encouraged us to give to the general fund so that the board can place the money wherever it is needed. Bro. Danny mentioned the work of the cross-county revival led by Rev. Johnny Perkins and Rev. Craig Bell. This revival has a goal of preaching in every county in Indiana (92 total). SBMI has been able to support this work over the past year. Bro. Danny encourage us to invite someone to come to church. He said if everyone brought just one person that our attendance would double. He encouraged us to have a zeal to go out and invite people to church. Bro. Danny turned the service over to Rev John Perkins of the Central Indiana Association for the mission sermon.

Bro. John opened by stating how much he looked forward to attending the association. Bro. John said he loved to talk about missions. Bro. John mentioned how important the people around the world are to God. Bro. John read Luke 7:31 & 32. He also read Luke 23:28 and announced his text, "weeping". BY-LAWS OF SEPARATE BAPTIST MISSIONS, INC. UNDER THE GENERAL ASSOCIATION OF SEPARATE BAPTISTS

Separate Baptist Missions, Inc.

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall be a religious non-profit incorporation for the establishment, furtherance and overseeing of Separate Baptist home and foreign missionary enterprises. The Incorporation shall be established in accordance with the laws of the state of Kentucky and shall be registered to conduct its lawful affairs and privileges in each state, either represented by an established Separate Baptist Church or represented for the establishment of a new Separate Baptist Church in fellowship with the General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ (hereafter referred to as the General Association).

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall consist of a board of three members who are elected for three-year terms by the General Association and of associational directors who will be elected or appointed to yearly terms by the District Associations. It shall be the duty of this board, in-as-much as possible, to carry out the desires of the General Association in all mission matters.

Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated shall be governed with the bylaws established and approved by the General Association. The by-laws may be altered or amended at any General Association by a two-thirds majority vote of the voting delegates. No by-law, established or amended, shall knowingly violate the law(s) of the states under which this incorporation is registered.

Should this incorporation ever be dissolved, all records, monies and properties held by the incorporation at the time of dissolvement shall be turned over to the General Association for disbursement as the General Association may deem necessary and proper.

BY-LAWS OF

SEPARATE BAPTIST MISSIONS INCORPORATED

Section One

The Board

- 1. Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall have a board consisting of a chairman, a secretary, a treasurer, an assistant treasurer and associational directors. Each board member shall assume his responsibilities upon his election or appointment to office and shall serve in said office until his successor is elected or appointed. The board members shall obtain office and serve terms of duration as follows.
 - A. The chairman of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration.
 - B. The treasurer and assistant treasurer of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration with their term expiring the year prior to the expiration of the chairman's term.
 - C. The secretary of this board shall be elected by the General Association for a term of three years duration with his term expiring the year prior to the expiration of the treasurer's term.
 - D. The associational directors of this board shall be elected by the District associations for a term of one year duration. They shall be elected yearly. There shall be one Associational director elected from each District association.
- All members of the board and personnel serving under the board must be Separate Baptist personnel.
- 3. A board member may be re-elected or re-appointed to successive terms.
- 4. The board of Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall meet at least once during every associational year other than at the General Association. They may also meet on assent of the board members when and as necessary. Written notices stating the time, date, location and purpose of each special board meeting shall be sent in advance to each board member.
- A Quorum of five board members shall be required to transact official board business.
- 6. All board members shall serve without pay or reimbursement from mission funds *

(With the exception of the treasurer and the secretary who may be reimbursed from the Home Missions fund as deemed proper by the board).

* Changed October 12, 1991 at the General Association.

Section Two Funds and Property

- 1. All funds are to be received on a voluntary manner and no church or District association shall ever be assessed for mission funds.
- The treasurer of the board shall keep a permanent record of all receipts and expenditures and shall present a written yearly financial report to the general Association.

- A. The treasurer's books are to be audited yearly at the General Association by the Auditing Committee.
- B. The treasurer shall be bonded and said bond shall be paid for as general operating expenses.
- Separate accounts and records shall be kept for home and foreign missions funds
 - A. All undesignated funds received by the treasurer shall be subject to the discretion of the mission board, for either home or foreign mission purposes.
 - B. All funds received designated for a particular purpose shall be used entirely for such designated purpose. If such funds cannot be used for its designated purpose, they shall be returned to their donor and an explanation given as to why they could not be used.
 - A tax-exempt receipt shall be given upon request for all gifts and donations.
- 4. All general operating expenses of the board shall be paid for from the home mission fund.
- 5. The board shall have the authority to withdraw and use funds from their respective accounts for either home or foreign missionary projects.
 - A. Grants or loans cannot be made to any individual for personal use.
 - B. Grants or loans may be made for worthwhile purposes to District associations or churches which may request such aid.
 - C.* Grant amounts shall not exceed five thousand \$5,000.00 given to any one church within one associational year.
 - D.* Loans may not exceed in the amount of ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars and are to be repaid within a period designated at the time of said loan. No interest shall be charged for money loaned.
 - E. A minimum of \$5,000.00 emergency fund will be maintained in the Foreign Mission Treasury.
- 6. All property purchased through the mission board for the establishment of a Separate Baptist Church shall be deeded to the trustees and their successors of the District association in which the church is established. (In event that the District association does not have trustees to which the property may be deeded, it shall remain deeded to Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated)
- All property purchased on the foreign field in behalf of Separate Baptist Missions, Inc. shall remain, where possible, the property of Separate Baptist Missions, Incorporated.
 - * Changed October 12, 2012 at the General Association.

Section Three Missionary Personnel

- All missionaries serving under this board shall preach and teach according to the doctrinal statement of the General Association of Separate Baptist Churches.
- All missionary candidates shall be examined by the board in regards to doctrinal, spiritual and mental requirements and shall furnish a doctor's statement on their physical condition.
- 3. All missionary candidates must do their deputation work with the mission board only assisting.

- 4. All missionaries shall serve pre-designated terms on the mission field and must spend a proportionate amount of time while on furlough in the states reporting to the churches which contributed to their support.
- All missionaries must send regular monthly reports to the board concerning their work and progress while on the field.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1: This body shall be called "The General Association of Separate Baptists in Christ" and shall be composed of ministers, deacons and delegates of the various District Associations and their several churches.

ARTICLE 2: Officers of this body shall be: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary who shall be elected by this body and shall hold office one year or until their successors are elected, and shall serve free, except the Clerk, who shall be paid \$200.00 for his services by the Association.

ARTICLE 3: Duty of the moderator shall be: Preside at all meetings, appoint all committees and cast the deciding vote in the case of a tie. Duties of the Assistant Moderator shall be the same as the Moderator in case of his absence. The Clerk shall make complete Minutes of the proceedings of the Association, inserting in the Minutes the name and addresses of the ministers and church Clerks. The Clerk shall make completed minute books available to the churches no later than March 1 of each associational year if at all possible. The Assistant Clerk shall do the duties of the Clerk in his absence and assist the Clerk at any time he may need him. The Treasurer shall receive and pay out money and make a report at each meeting. The Corresponding Secretary shall correspond with other associations, groups or individuals as directed by this body. No person shall hold more than one elected office in this organization. It shall be the duty of each District Association to contribute \$25.00 or more to the support of this body.

ARTICLE 4: The object of this body shall be to bring about a closer union and give united effort in putting forth the Word of Life.

ARTICLE 5: This Association thus formed shall be a council of advice and shall not exercise any undue authority over God's heritage. Each Association composing this body shall be entitled to three delegates from each church.

ARTICLE 6: This Association shall be governed by parliamentary rules.

ARTICLE 7: Any person wishing to address the body shall rise and address the Moderator.

ARTICLE 8: This body shall have a Mission Board which shall be authorized to oversee the Home and Foreign Mission aspects of our General Association. The said Mission Board shall be governed by the Rules and Regulations set forth

by the General Association. Such Rules and Regulations shall become a part of our General Association Constitution.

ARTICLE 9: Any Association belonging to this Association failing to report at each annual meeting, the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate why they did not report.

ARTICLE 10: Any Association applying for membership in this body shall be required to give evidence of its orthodoxy and shall agree to comply with the rules before being received into this body.

ARTICLE 11: This Constitution, By-Laws or Articles of Doctrine, may be changed or amended by a two-thirds vote* of the body at any regular session, after having been tabled for a period of one associational year. Any changes that are to be made in the Constitution will be presented to the Constitution Committee prior to its submission to this body. The Constitution Committee shall consist of one member from each district association. The Moderator shall appoint a member to the Constitution Committee from each district association. Should the committee be required to convene to act upon any proposal and the appointed member be absent, the General Association's Moderator shall name a replacement.

*Pursuant to action taken at the 1991 General Association "two-thirds vote" was defined as: "two-thirds of those who vote on that particular motion.

ARTICLE 12: The Pledges to American and Christian Flags and the Bible to be conducted by the Moderator at each morning session, prior to invocation and/or devotion.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The Association or Church entertaining the General Association shall be given the privilege of setting the beginning time of each session to be held in that Association or Church and the entertaining Association or Church shall advise the Program Committee for the session about the starting time before the Program Committee reports to the body.
- 2. There shall not be anyone placed on a program or a committee that is not present at that session of the General Association.
- 3. Each District Association shall be responsible to list the names of all delegates and alternates from each church appointed to represent them at the General Association in or with their respective letter to the General Association. The delegates and alternates listed on or with the letter for the District Associations will be the only recognized appointed delegates to the General Association.

ARTICLES OF DOCTRINE

- **ARTICLE 1:** We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice, using the King James version of the Holy Bible for English-speaking people (*see below). Romans 15:4, 1 Corinthians 10:11, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, Genesis 1:1 through Revelation 22:21.
- **ARTICLE 2:** We believe that there is in the God Head three Divine Personages: The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19, 1 Corinthians 12:3, 1 Timothy 2:5, Hebrews 1, 1 John 5:7.
- **ARTICLE 3:** We believe that man is in a fallen state before God and is unable to liberate himself by any ability he may possess by nature. Isaiah 63:1-5, John 6:44 & 14:6, Romans 8:1-20, 1 Corinthians 15:22.
- **ARTICLE 4:** We believe that salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are through faith in the life, death and resurrection, ascension and intercession of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. John 17:13-17, Hebrews 4:1-3, Ephesians 4:1-8, Titus 3:3-7, Revelation 1:18.
- **ARTICLE 5:** We believe that he who endures to the end, the same shall be saved. Matthew 10:22, 24:13, Hebrews 3:12, 10:38-39, Revelation 2:10.
- **ARTICLE 6:** We believe in the resurrection of the body, the just and the unjust, but every man in his own order, those who have done good, to eternal life, those who have done evil, to eternal damnation and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. Daniel 12:2, Matthew 25:31-46, Acts 17:31.
- **ARTICLE 7:** We believe that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked are eternal. Daniel 12:2, Matthew 25:46, Romans 5:21.
- **ARTICLE 8:** We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordained of Christ appointed in the Church and none but true believers are proper subjects, and that immersion is the Gospel mode of baptism. Matthew 28:19-20, Luke 22:17-20, John 13:14, Acts 2:41, Romans 6:4, Colossians 2:12.
- **ARTICLE 9:** We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week, or Lord's Day, and it should be spent in public or private worship, and we abstain from worldly concerns, except in case of necessity or mercy. Luke 23:56, John 20:26, Acts 20:7, 1 Corinthians 16:2. Revelation 1:10.
- **ARTICLE 10:** We believe it is our duty to be tender, affectionate to one another, in honor preferring one another, to study the happiness of God's people in general and do all we can to support, promote and spread the Gospel. Romans 12:10, Galatians 6:1-2, 10, 2 Corinthians 9:14.
- **ARTICLE 11:** We believe that Jesus Christ, by the Grace of God tasted death for every man, that none can partake of His Holy Divine benefits except by repentance toward God and Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; Infants and the innocent, due to lack of mental ability excepted, they being included in the covenant of God's Grace. Matthew 9:13, Luke 18:15-18, John 3:15-17, Acts 4:12, Romans 5:15, 1Timothy 2:5-6.
- **ARTICLE 12:** We believe that, at Christ's coming in the clouds of Heaven, all Christians will be gathered with Him in the clouds and that time shall be no more, thus leaving no time for a literal one thousand year reign. Matthew 24:29-31. Revelation 10:6, 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18, 2 Peter 3:10.
- *We believe that non-English speaking people should use a Bible comparable to the King James Version of the Holy Bible.
